RIPA

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What Is RIPA?

- California Assembly Bill 953
- The Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015

RIPA

- Prohibits racial and identity profiling by law enforcement.

RIPA

- Requires law enforcement agencies to report data to the Attorney General's Office on:
 - a. All vehicle and pedestrian stops
 - b. Citizen complaints alleging racial and identity profiling

Current- Required Data Elements

1. The date, time, and duration of the stop
2. The location of the stop
3. The reason for the stop

Current- Required Data Elements

4. Whether the stop was made during the course of responding to a call for service
5. Whether the stop was made during the course of performing a welfare or wellness check or an officer's community caretaking function

Current- Required Data Elements

6. The perceived race or ethnicity of the stopped person
7. The perceived gender of the stopped person
8. The perceived sexual orientation of the person stopped

Current- Required Data Elements

9. The perceived age of the stopped person
10. Whether the officer perceived the stopped person as having limited or no English fluency
11. The perceived or known disability of the stopped person

Current- Required Data Elements

12. All of the non-force-related actions taken by the officer during the stop
13. The basis for any search
14. Whether any contraband or evidence was discovered

Current- Required Data Elements

15. All of the force-related actions taken by the officer during the stop
16. The result of the stop

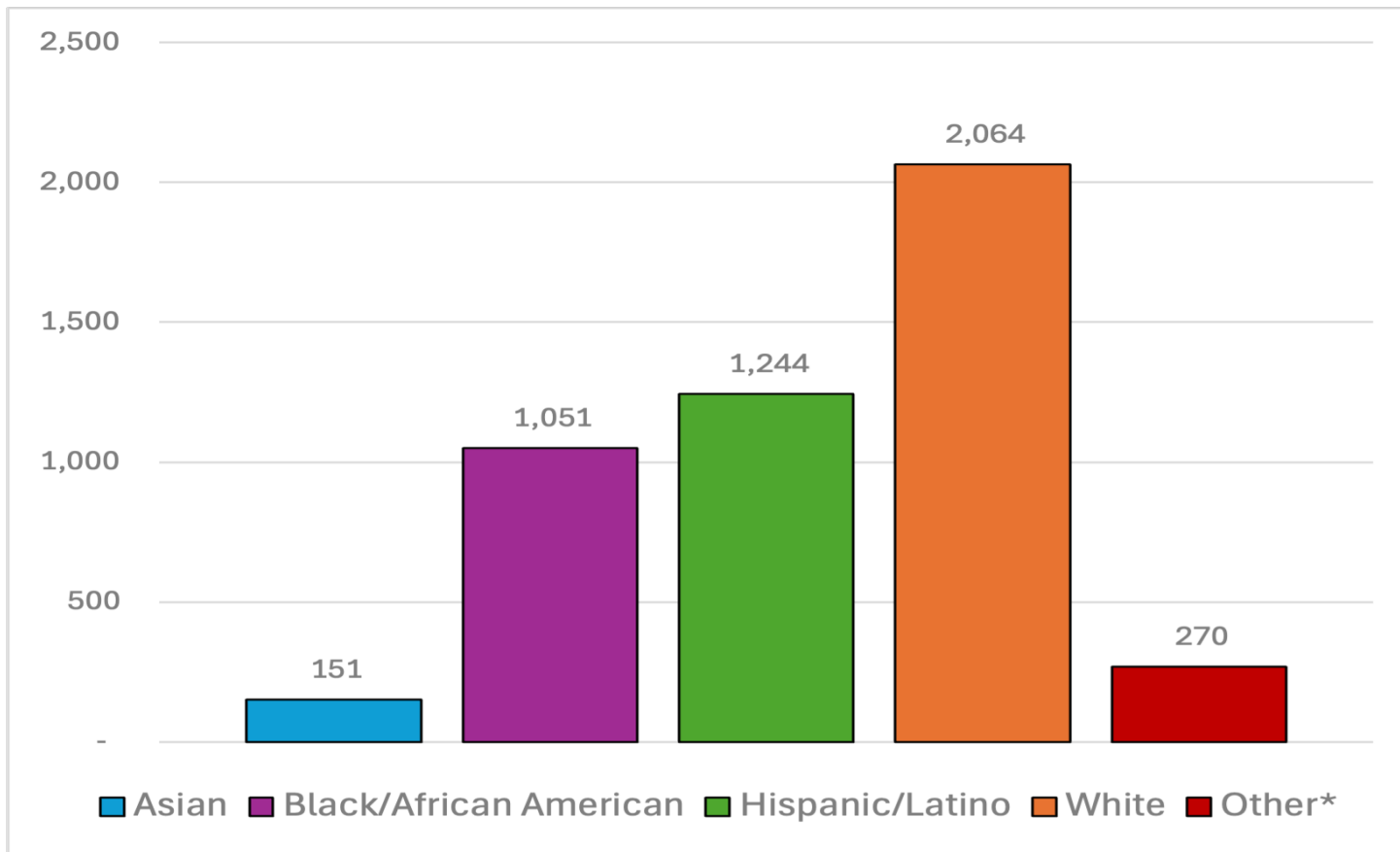

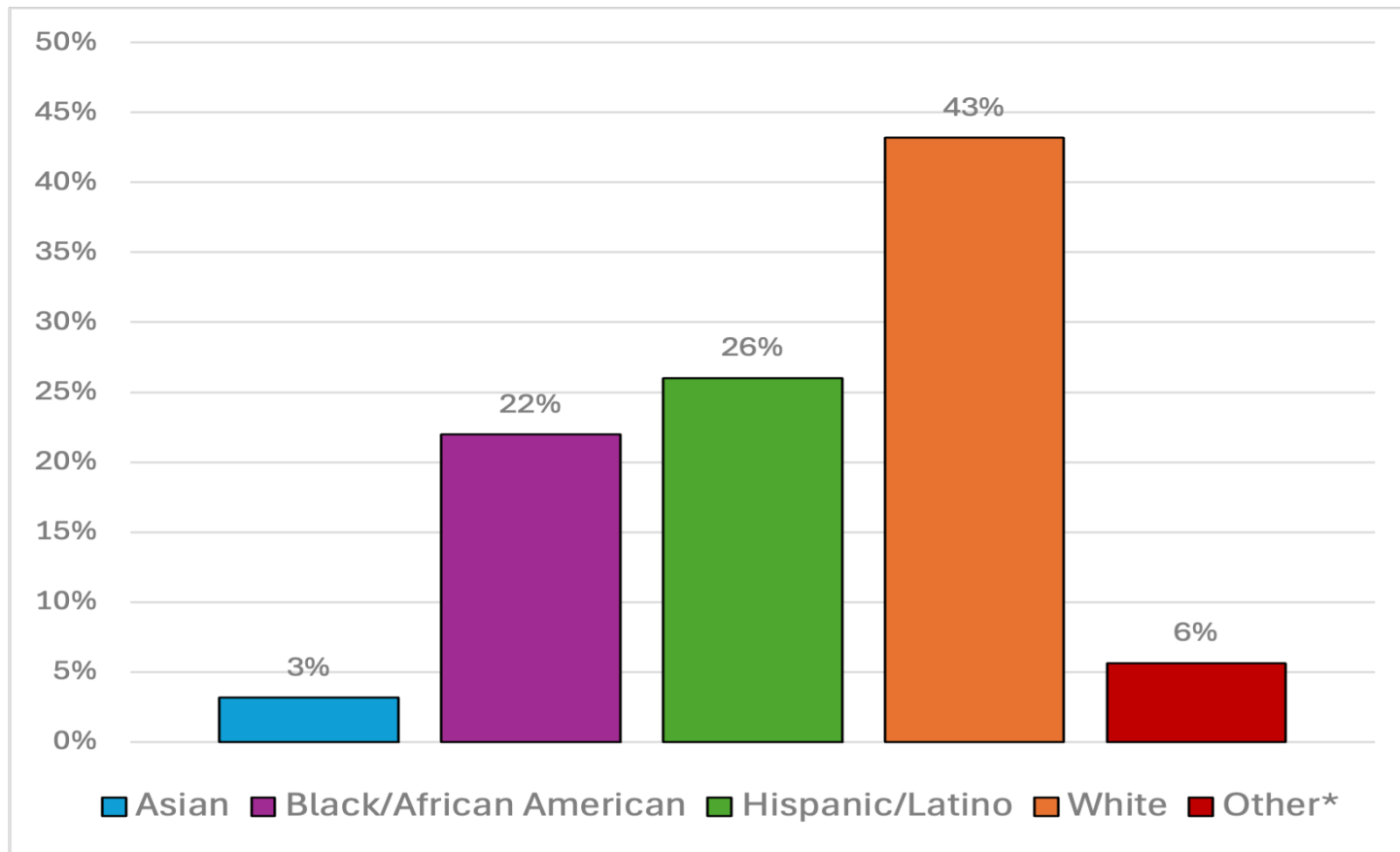

Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Perceived Races (Number)



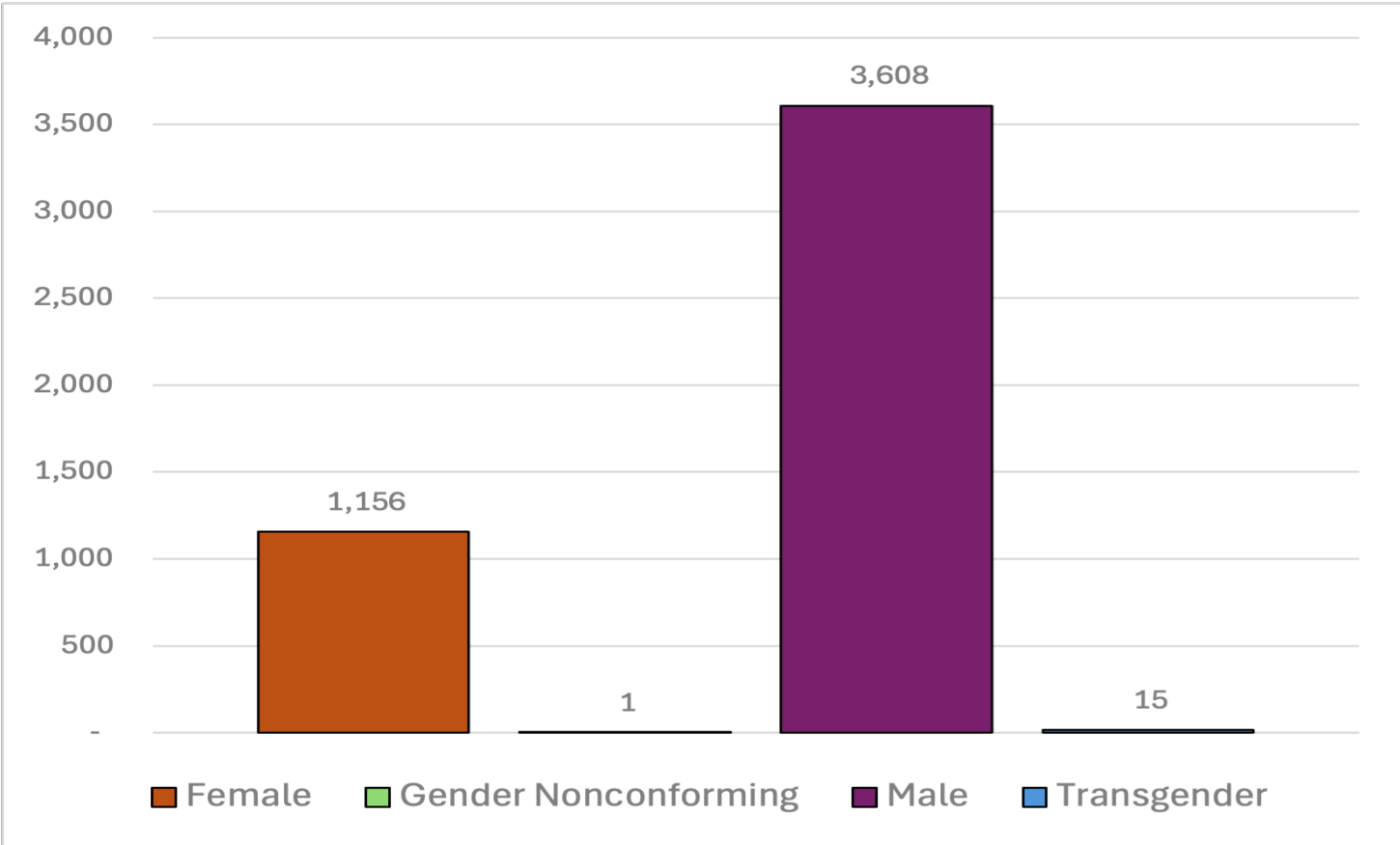
Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Perceived Races (Percent)



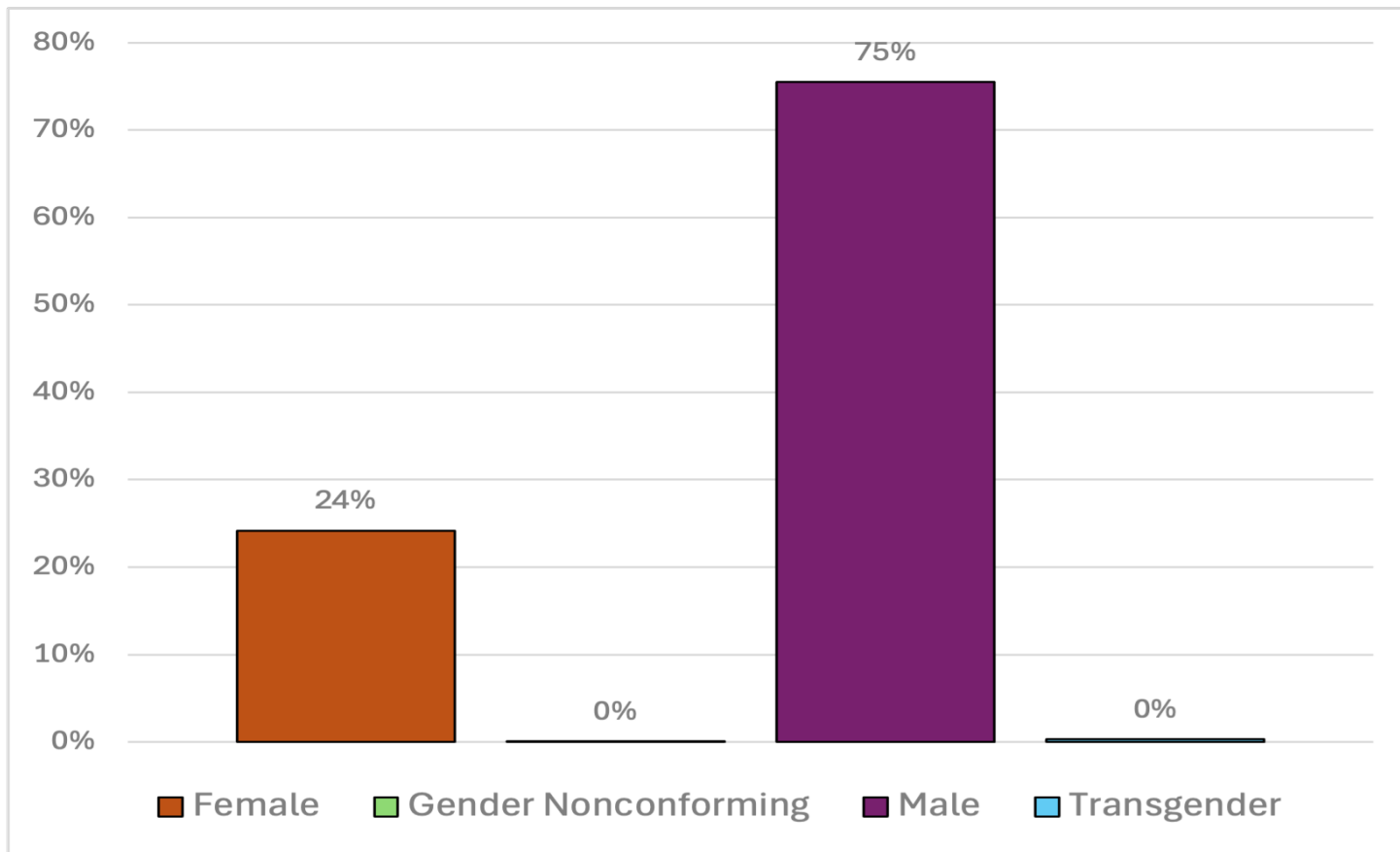

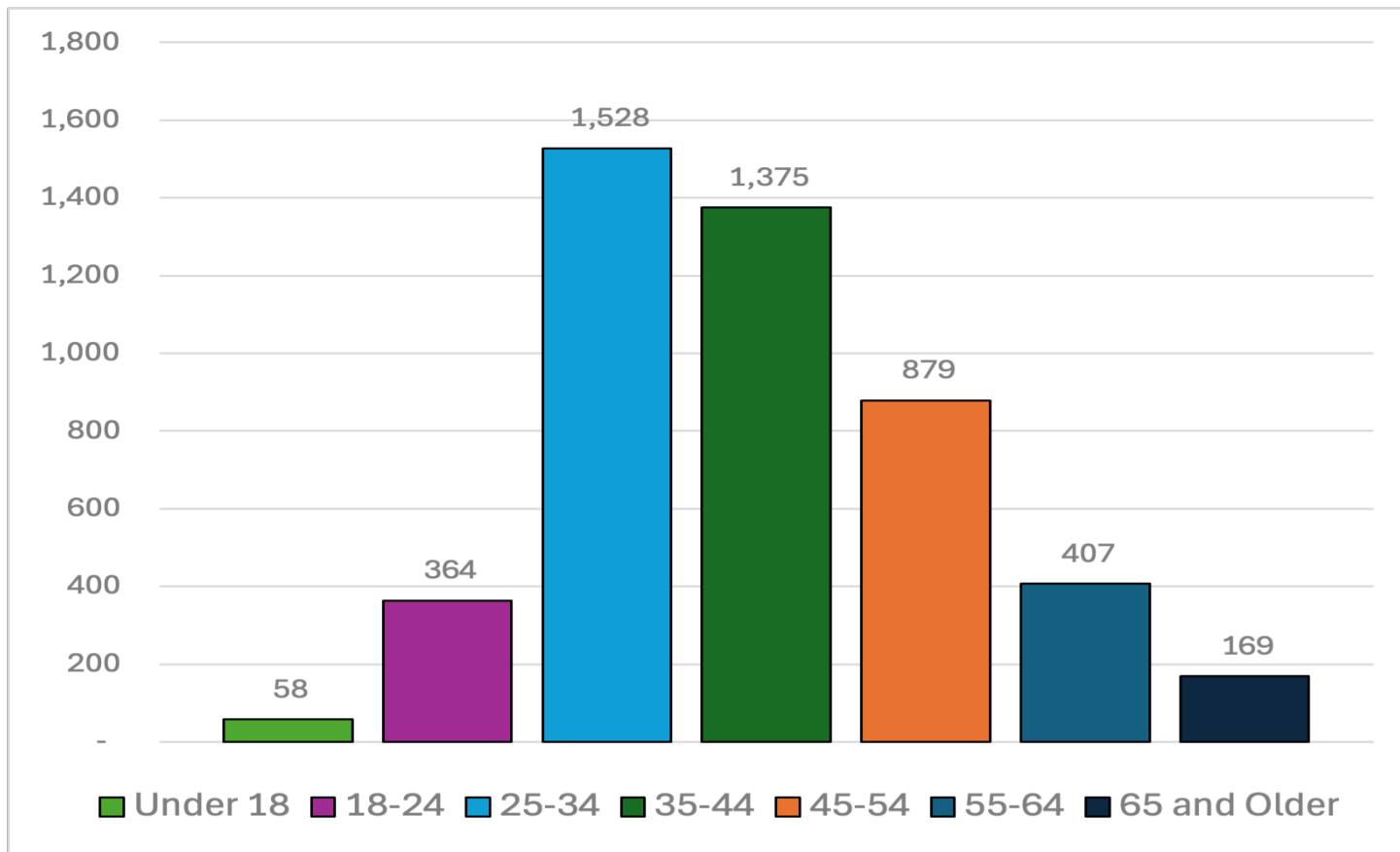
Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Perceived Genders (Number)



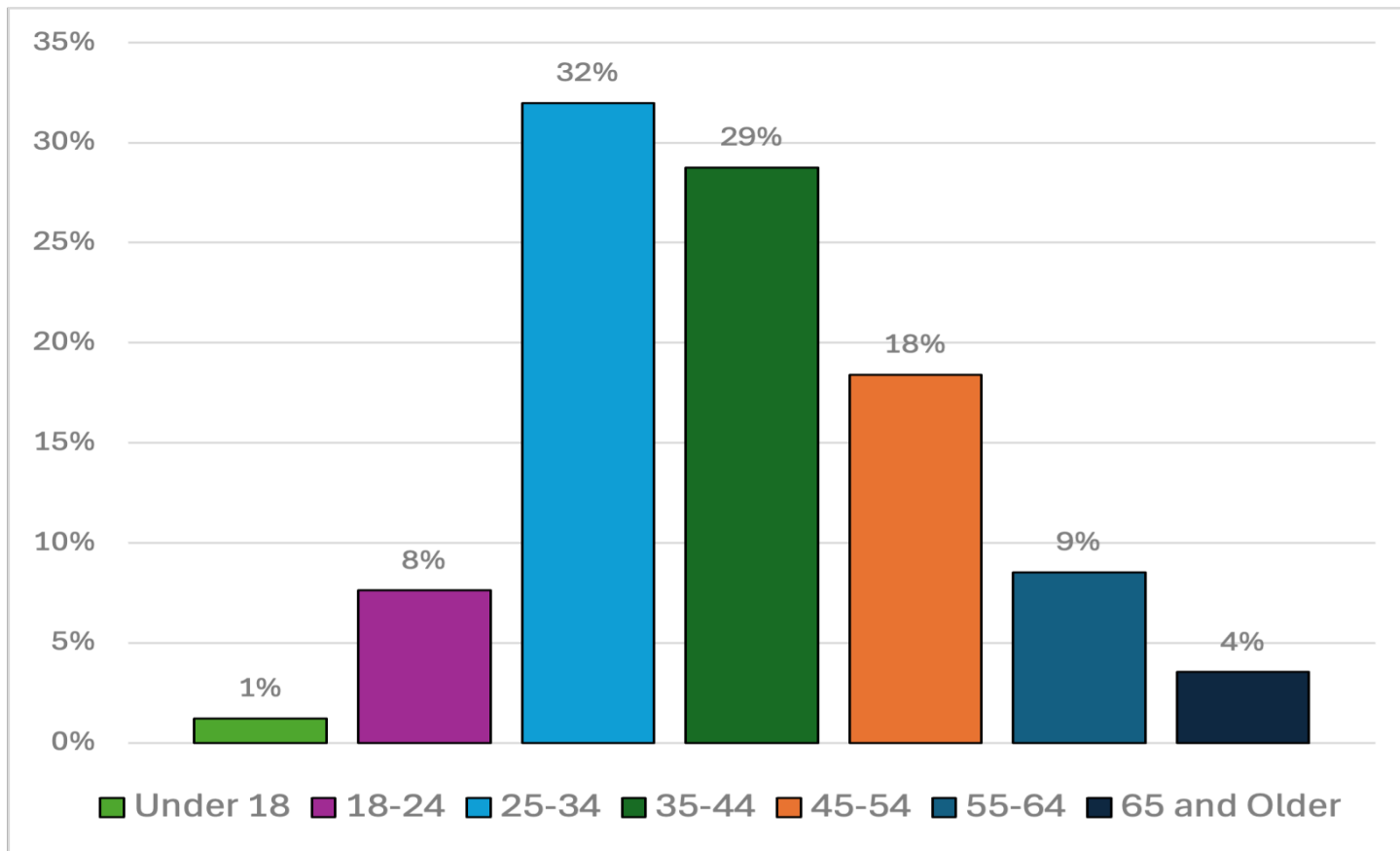
Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Perceived Genders (Percent)



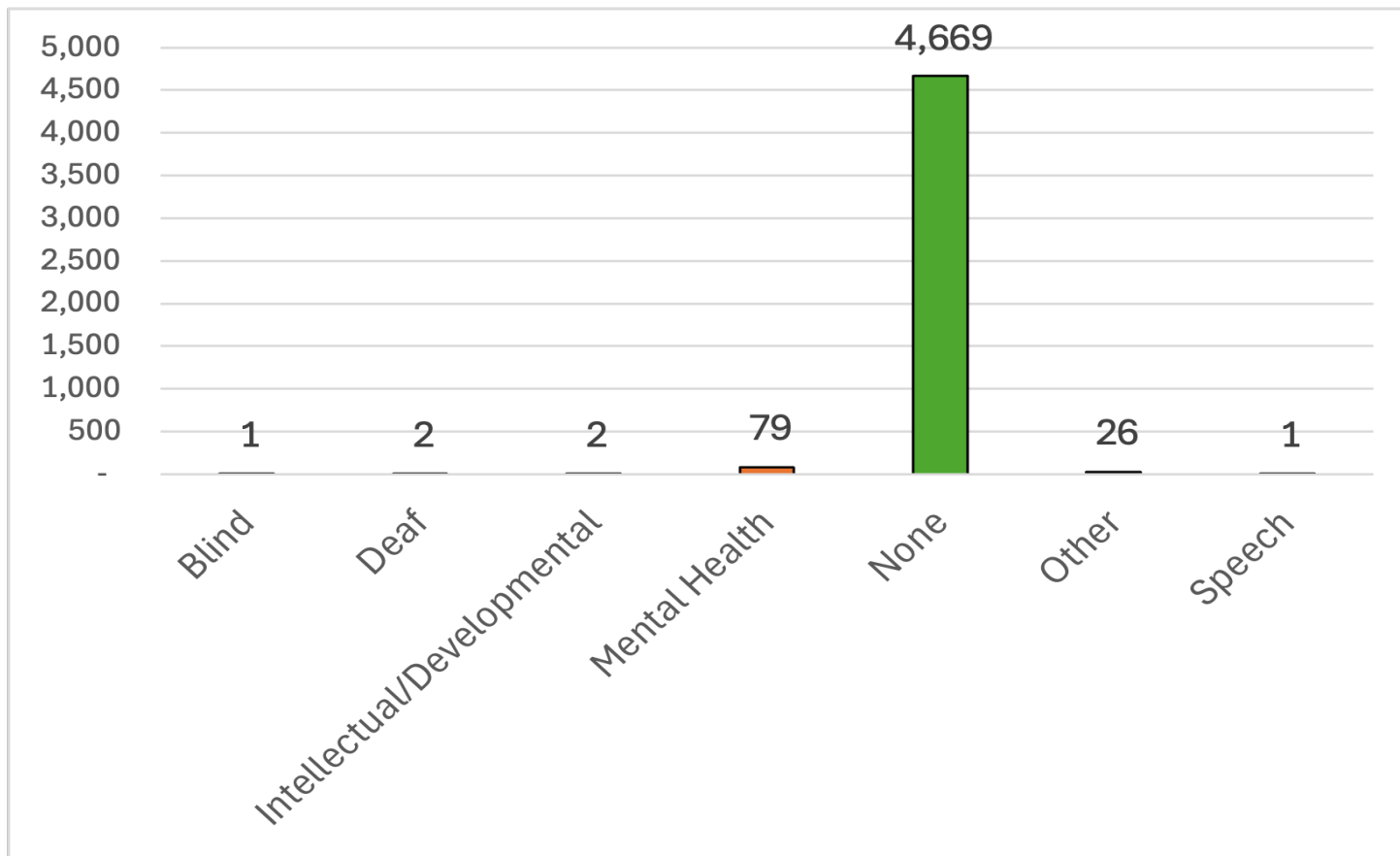
Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Age Categories (Number)



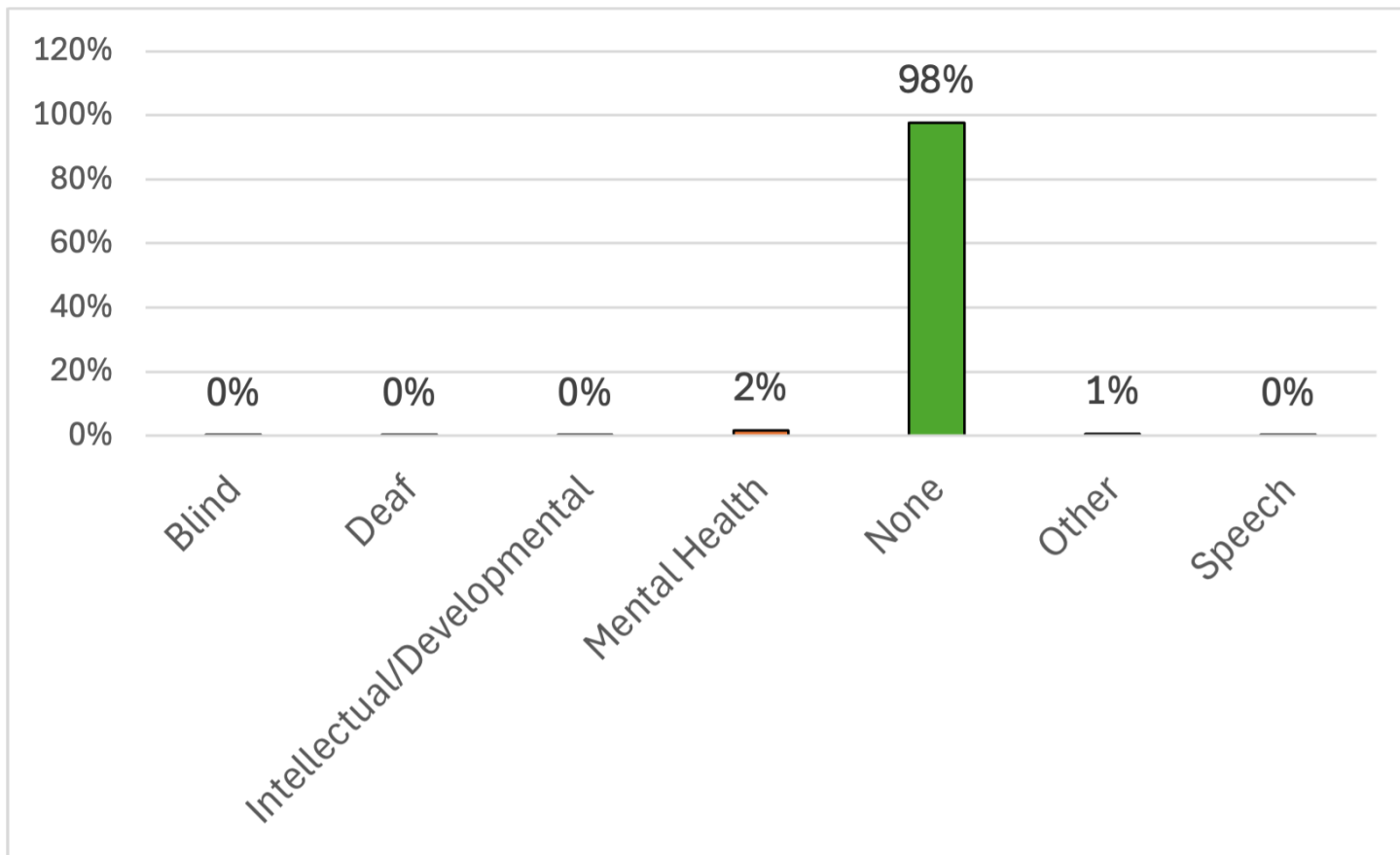
Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Age Categories (Percent)



Total 2023 SMPD Stops by Perceived Disabilities (Number)



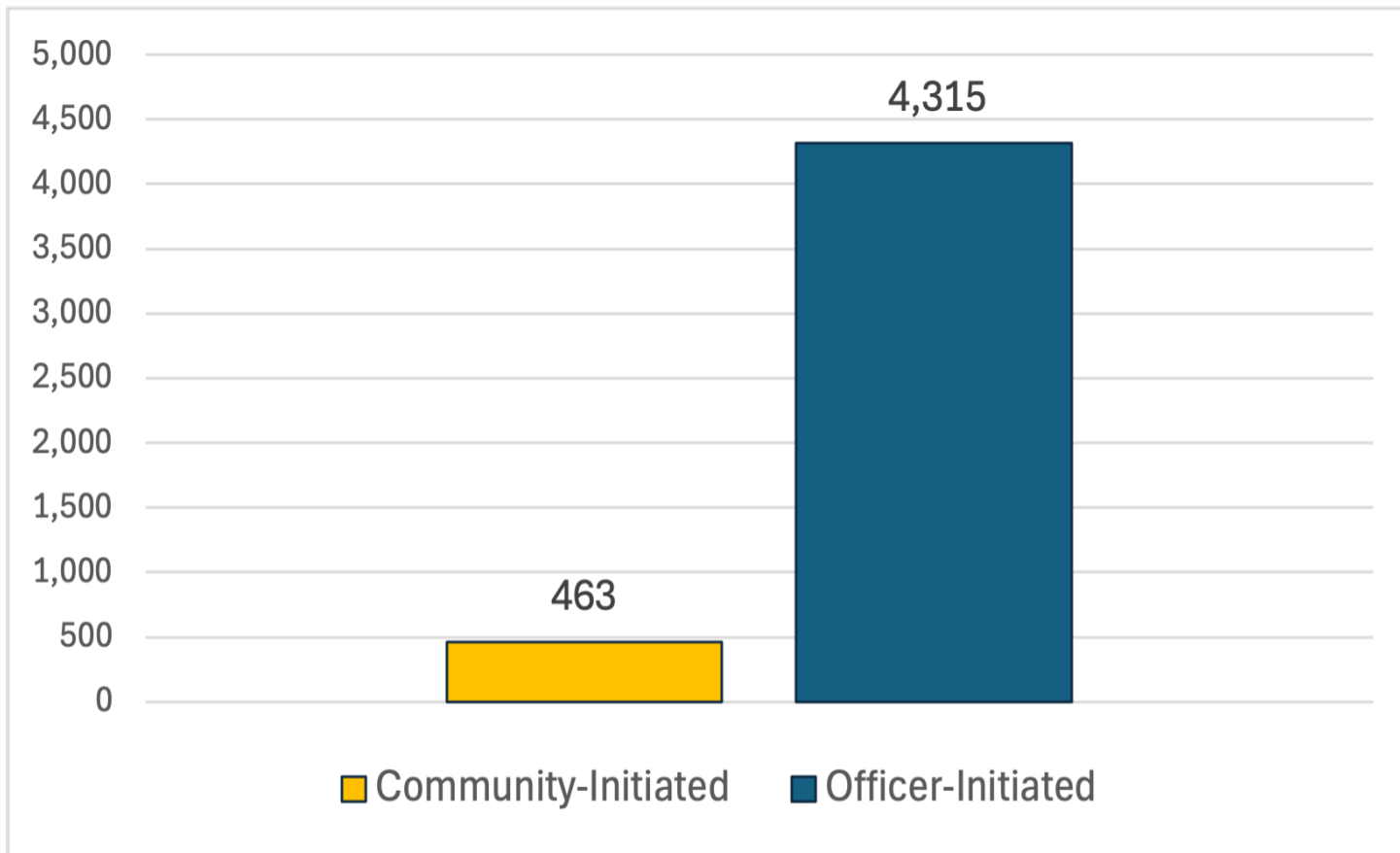

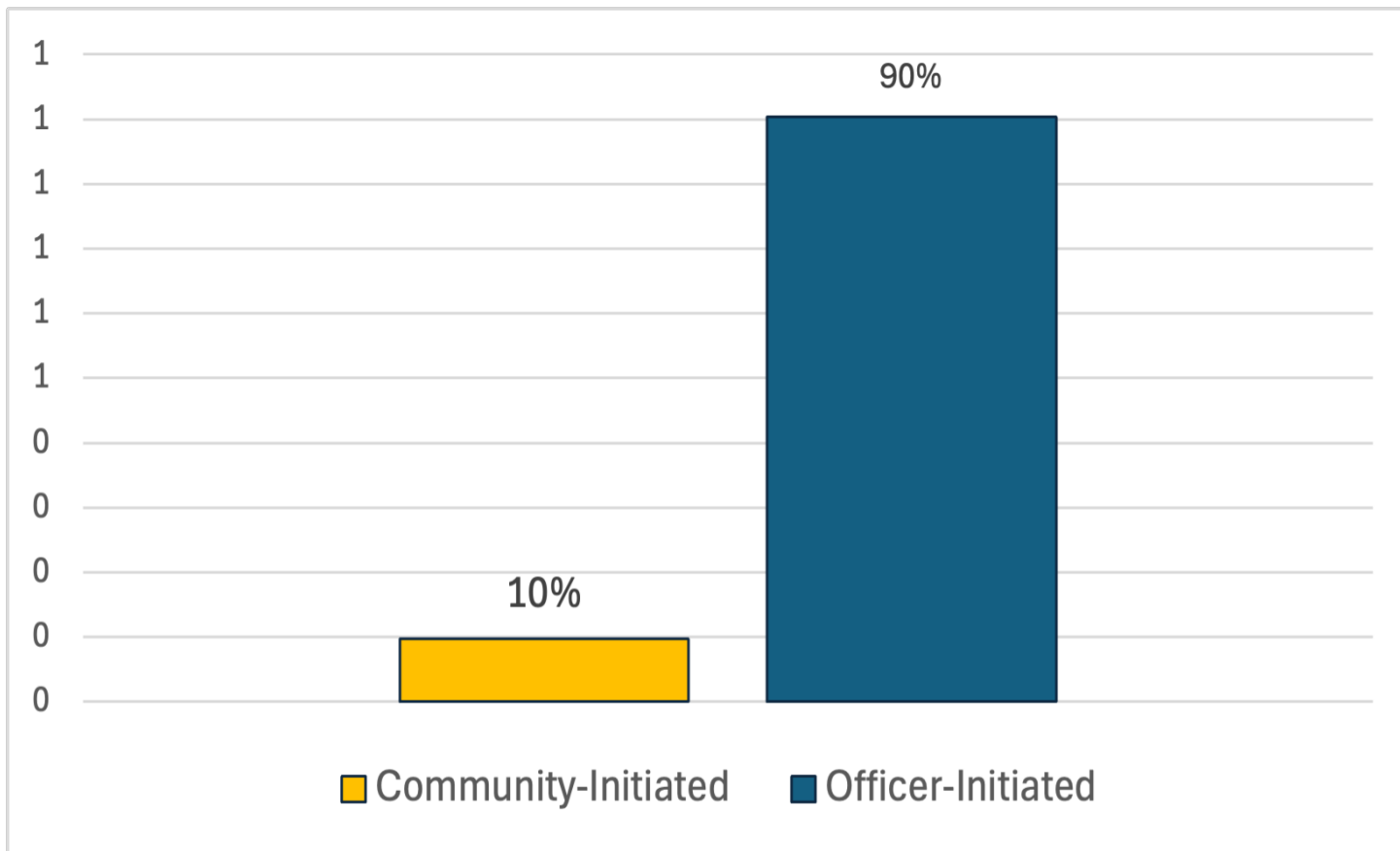

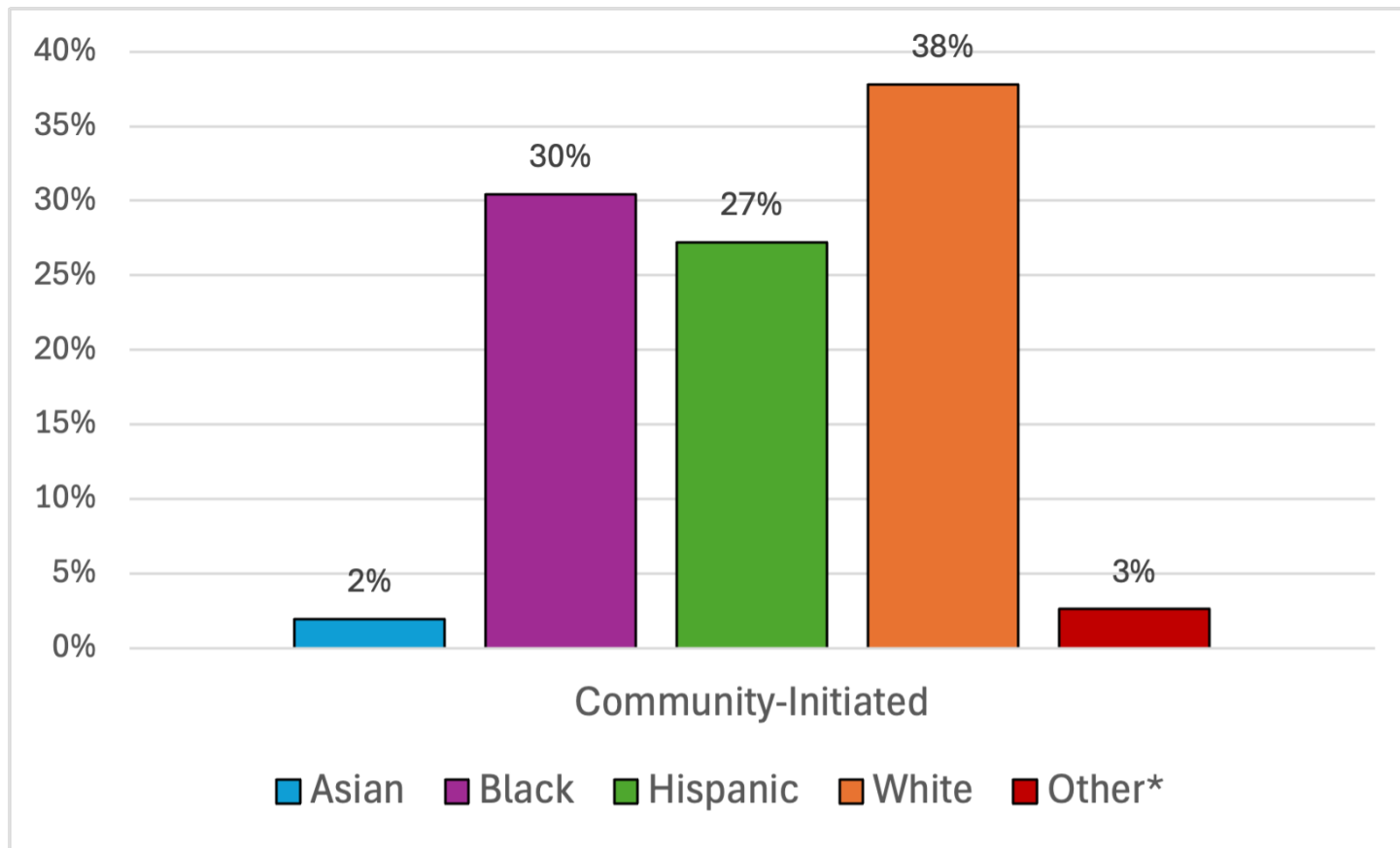
2023 SMPD Stop Sources (Number)



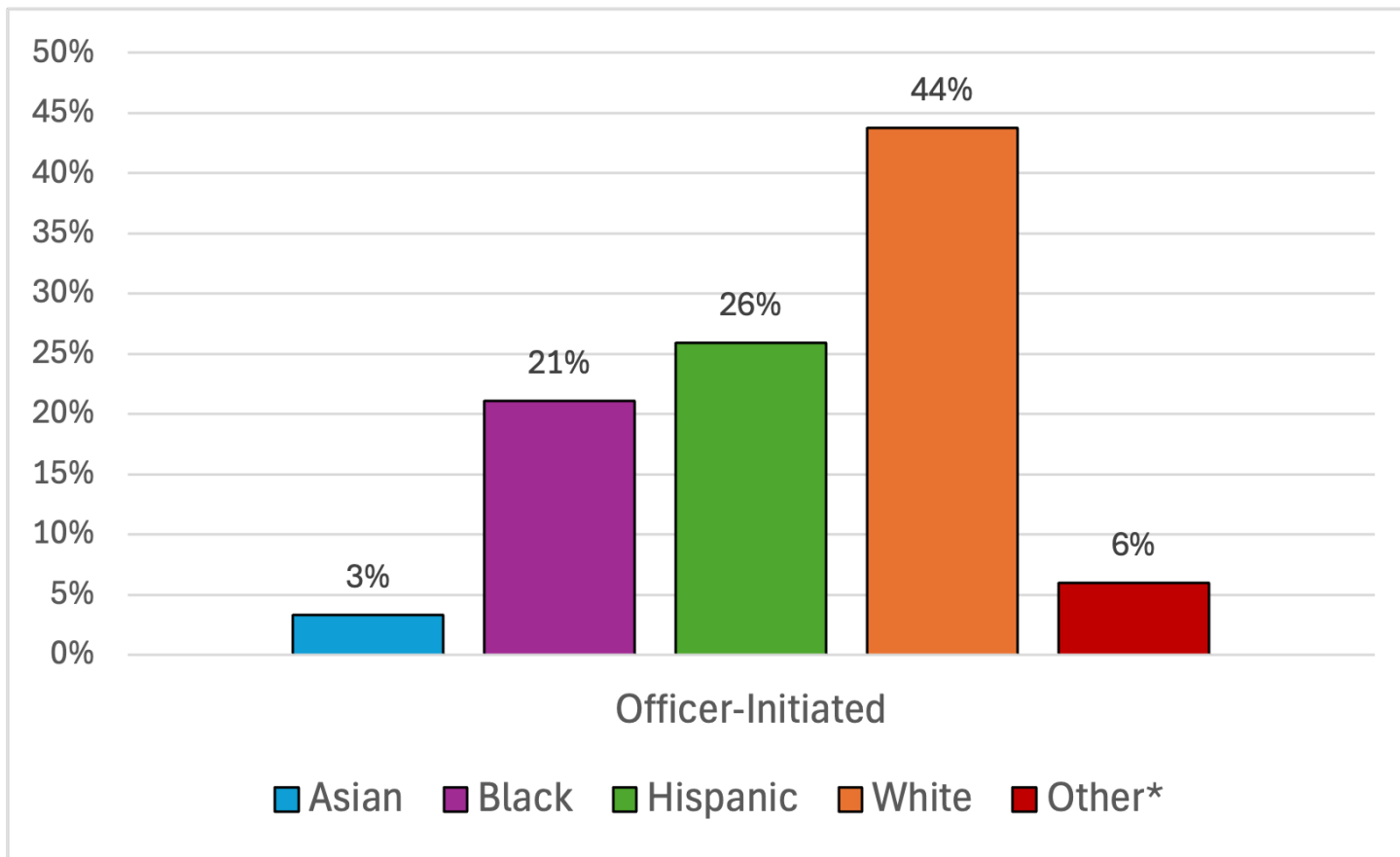
2023 SMPD Stop Sources (Percent)



2023 SMPD Stop Sources C-I by Perceived Races (Percent)



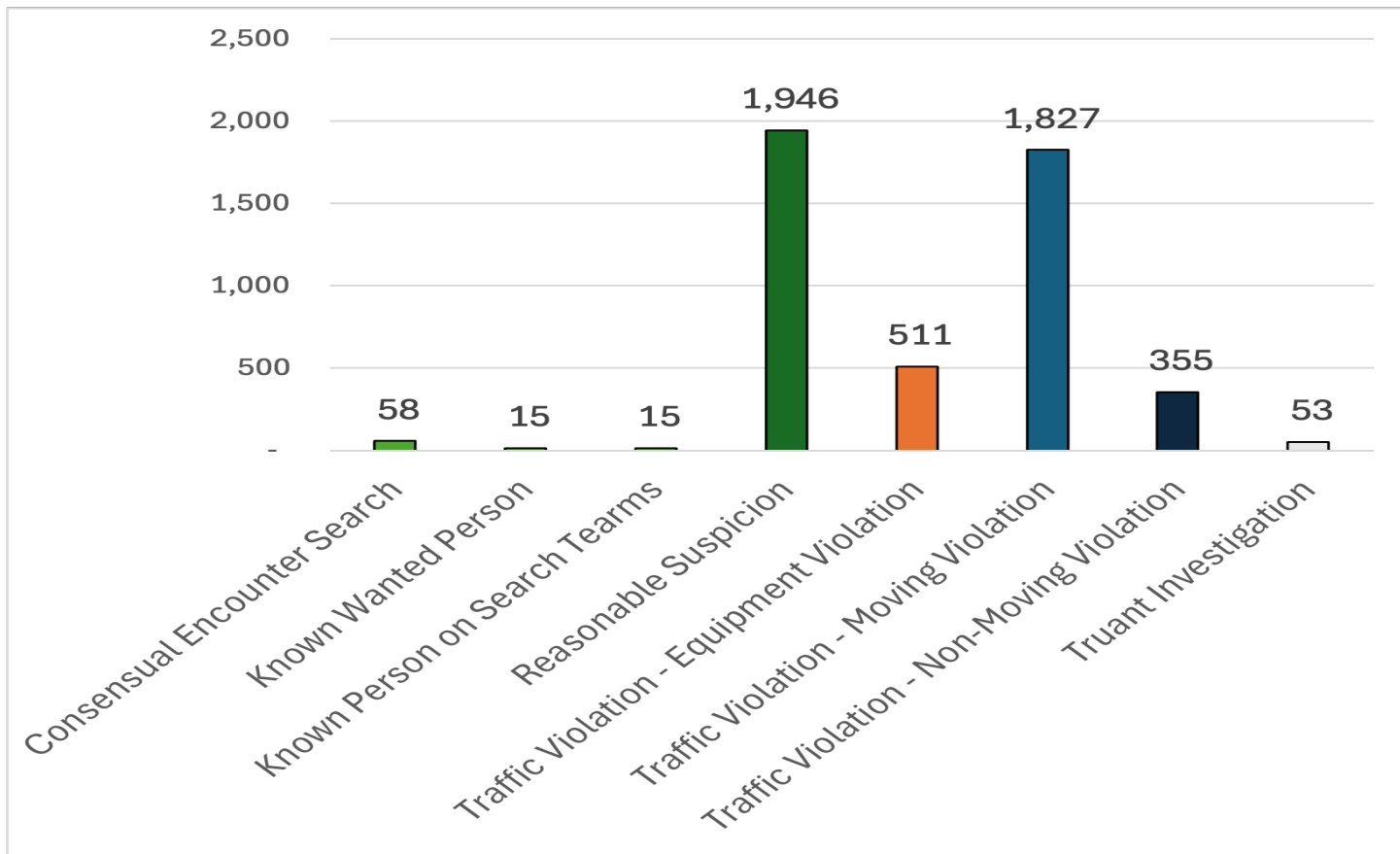
2023 SMPD Stop Sources O-I by Perceived Races (Percent)

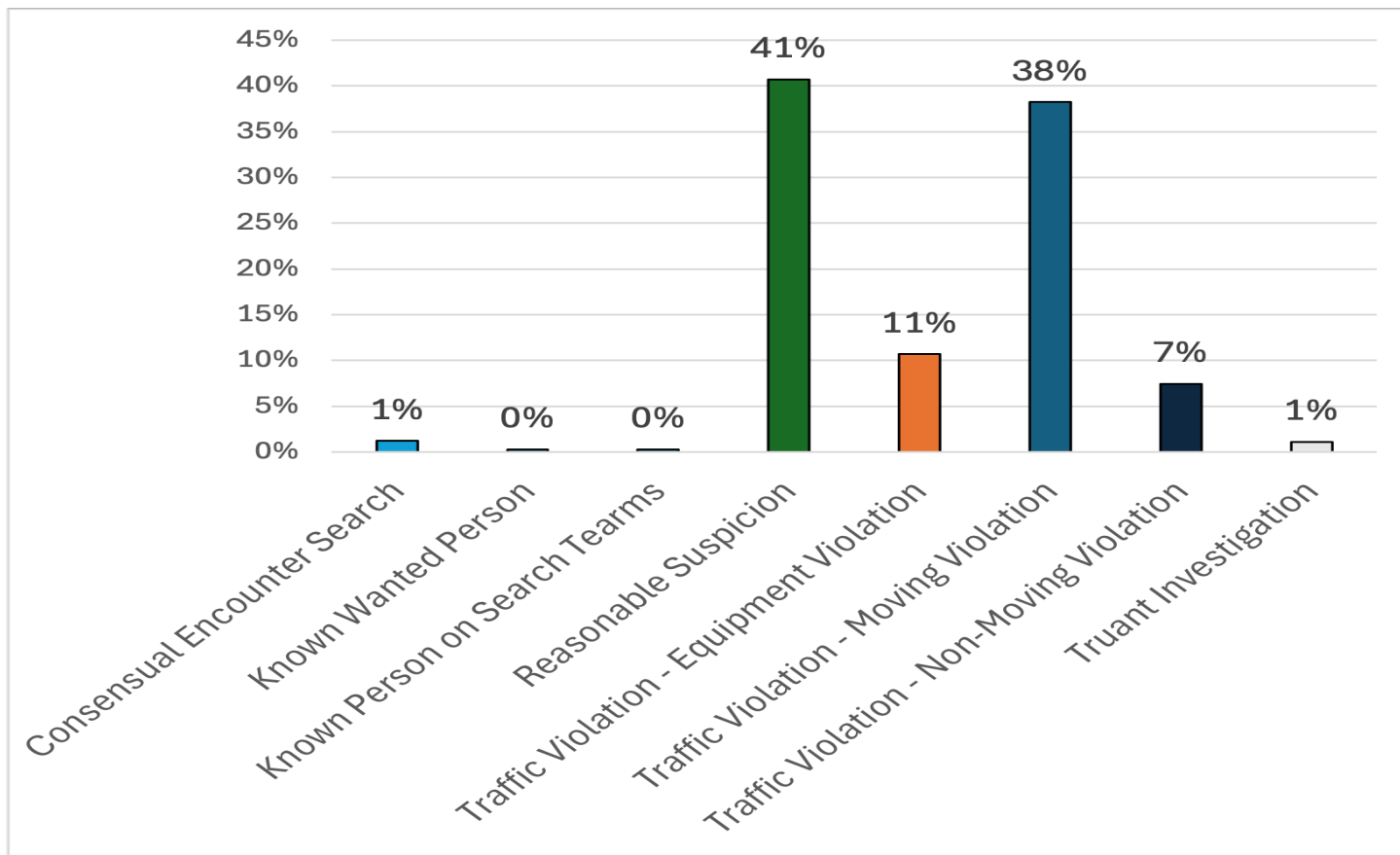
2023 SMPD Stop Reasons (Number)



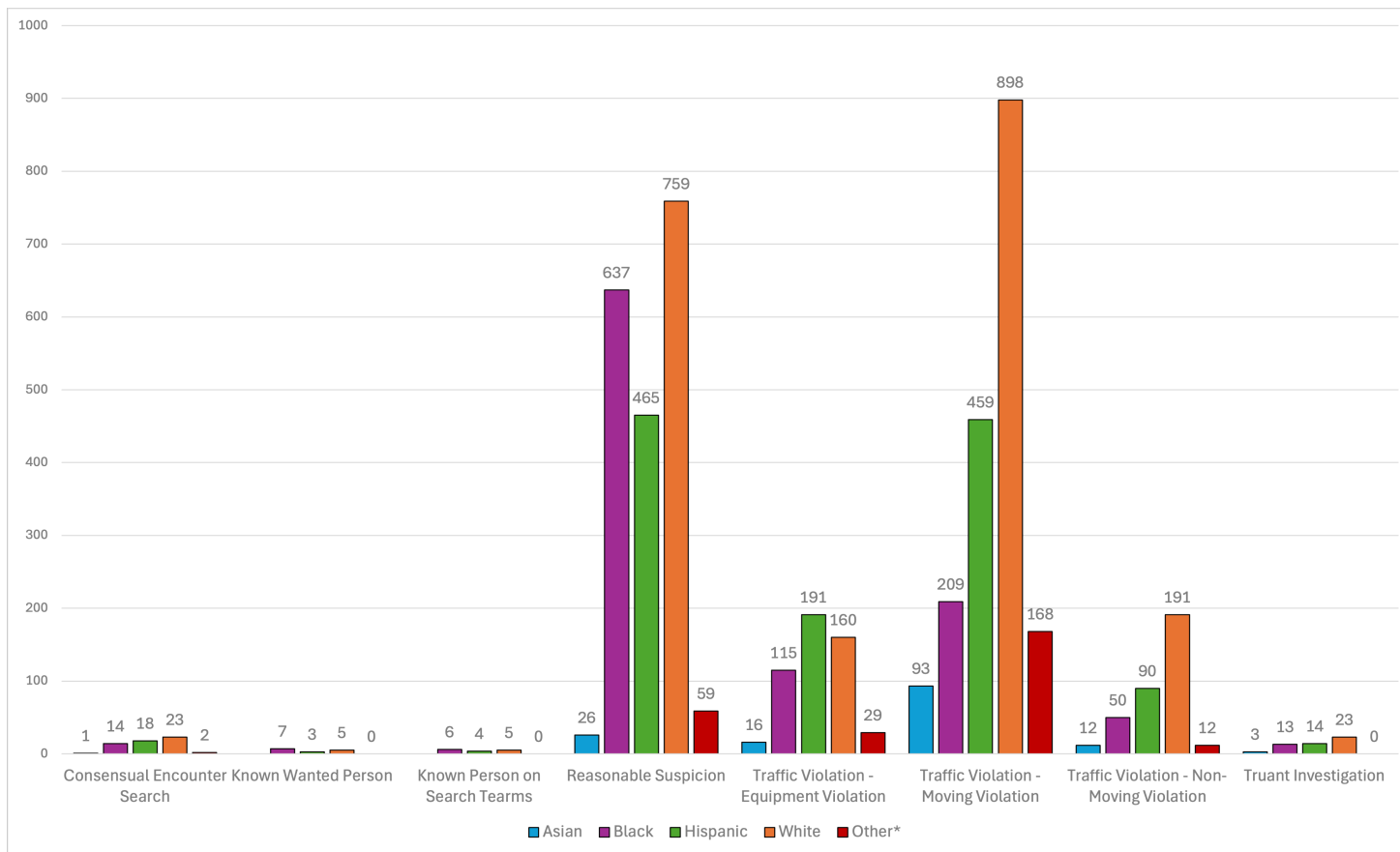

2023 SMPD Stop Reasons (Percent)



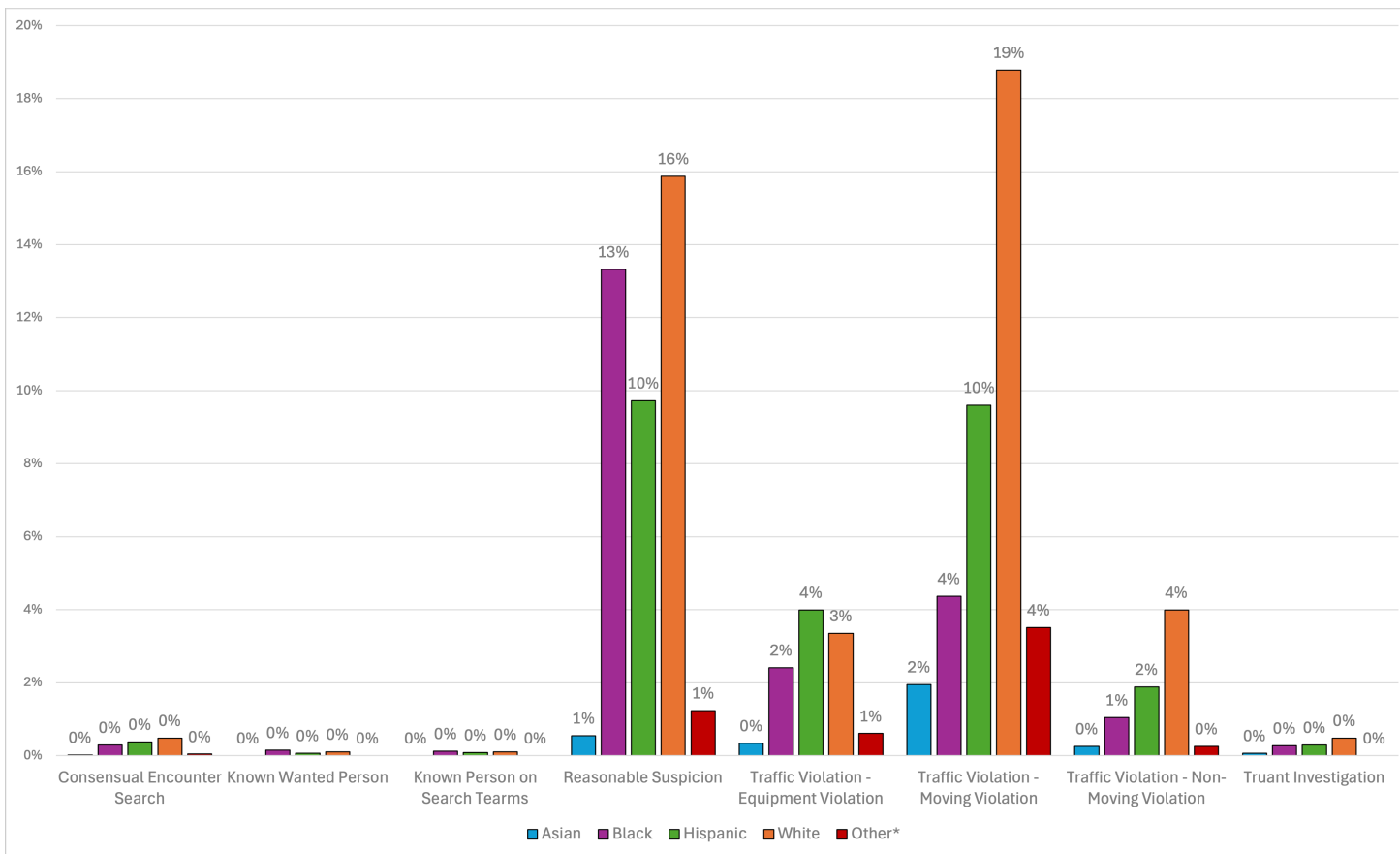
2023 SMPD Stop Reasons by Perceived Races (Number)

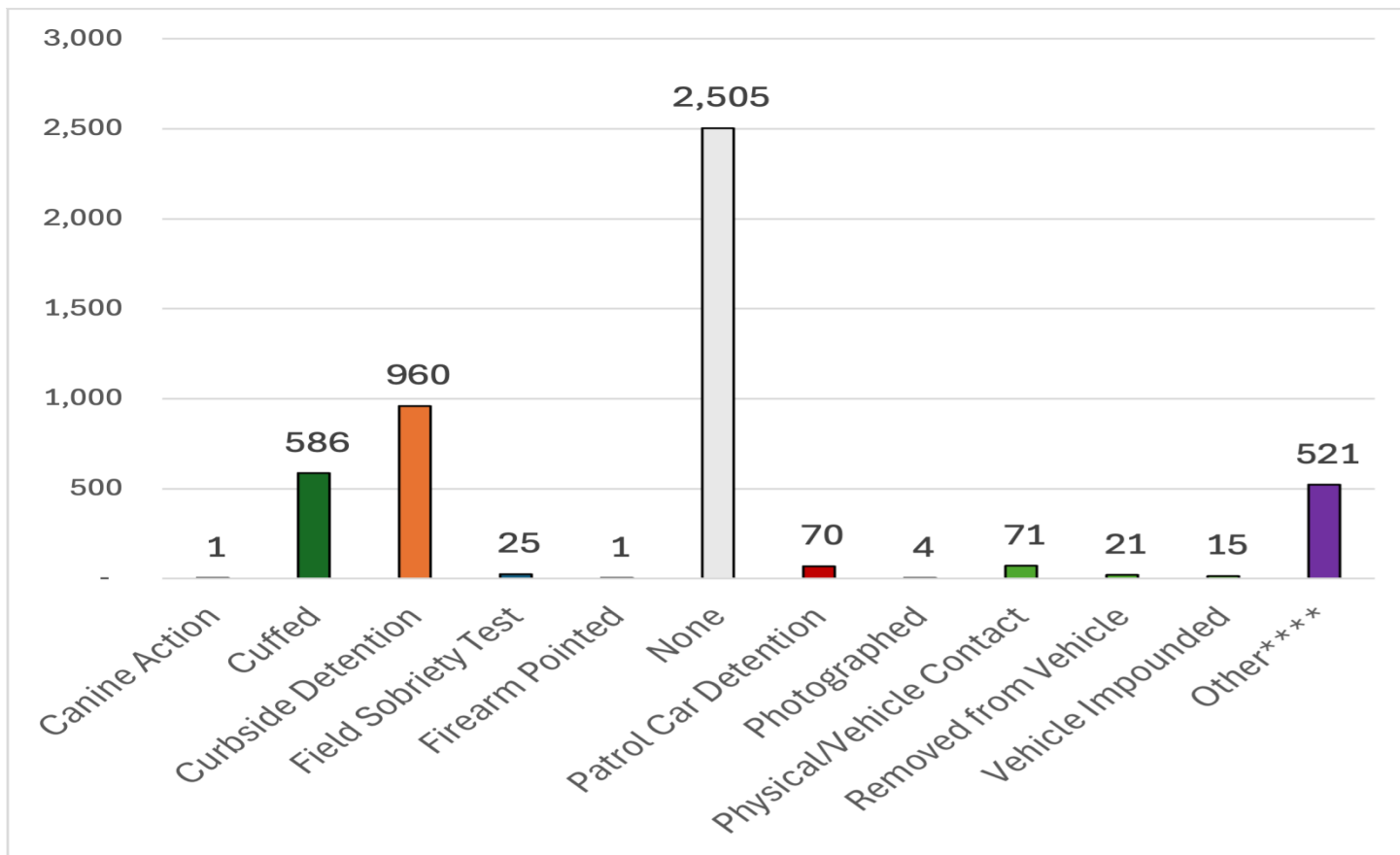
2023 SMPD Stop Reasons by Perceived Races (Percent)

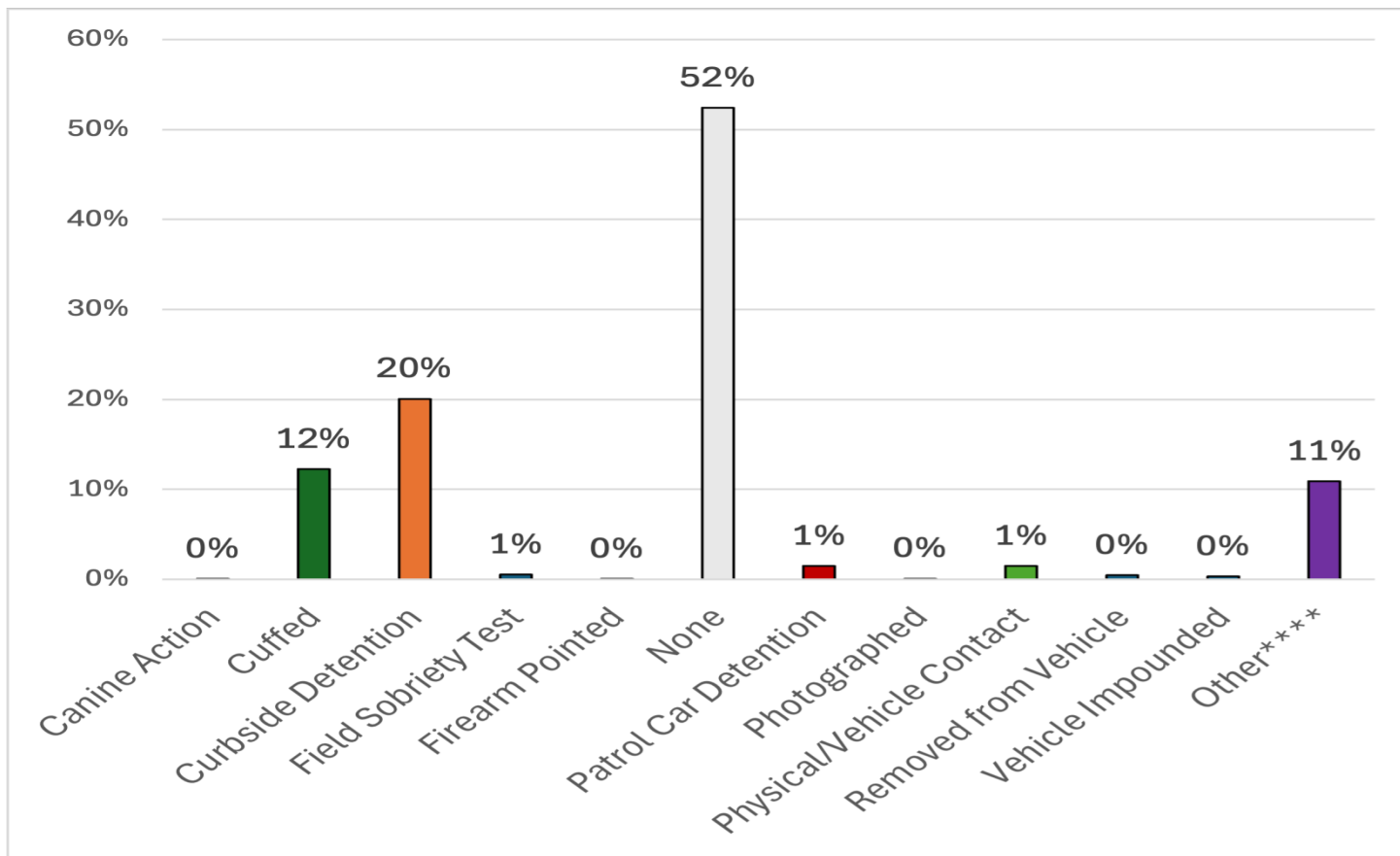
2023 SMPD Stop Actions (Number)



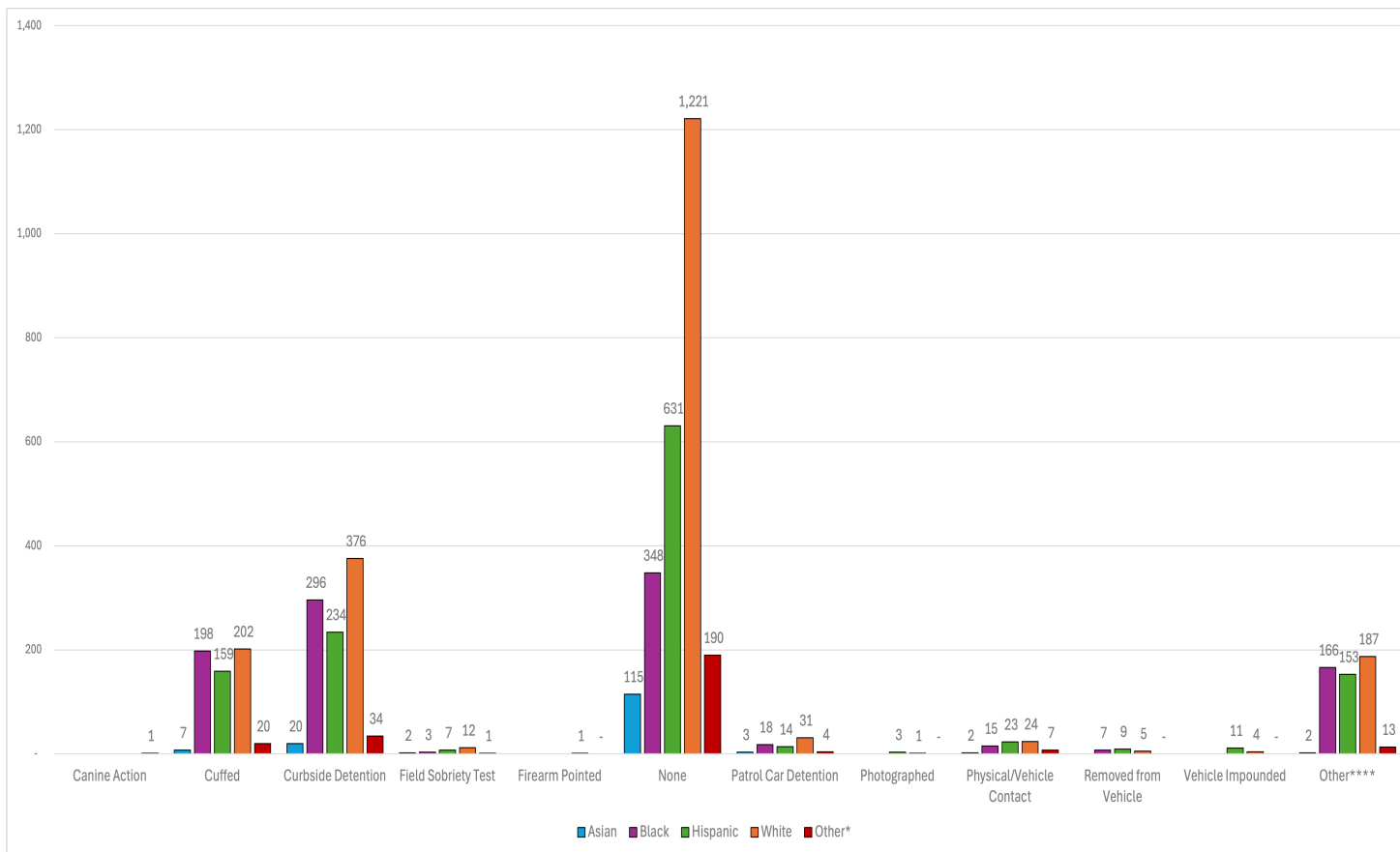

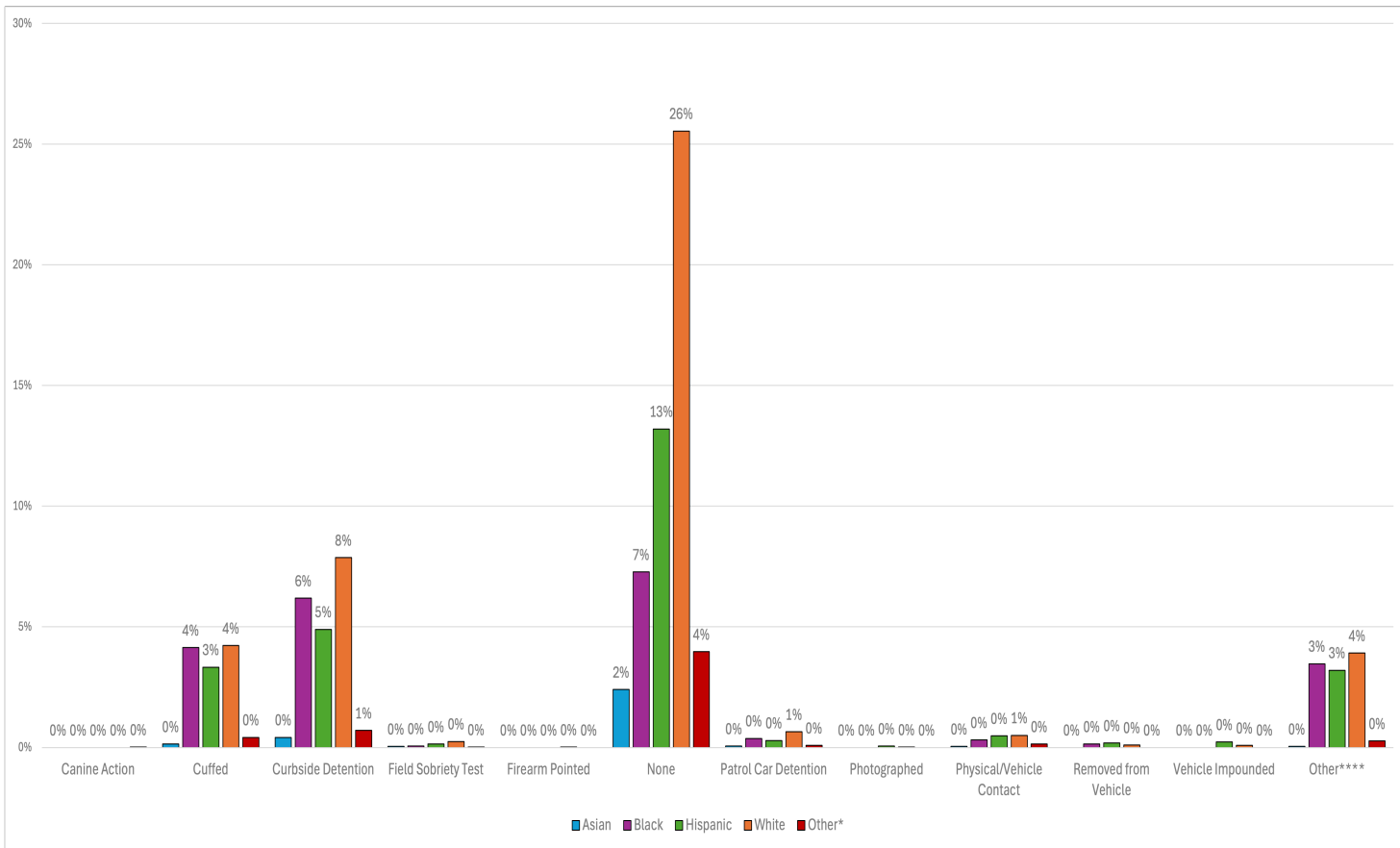
2023 SMPD Stop Actions by Perceived Races (Number)

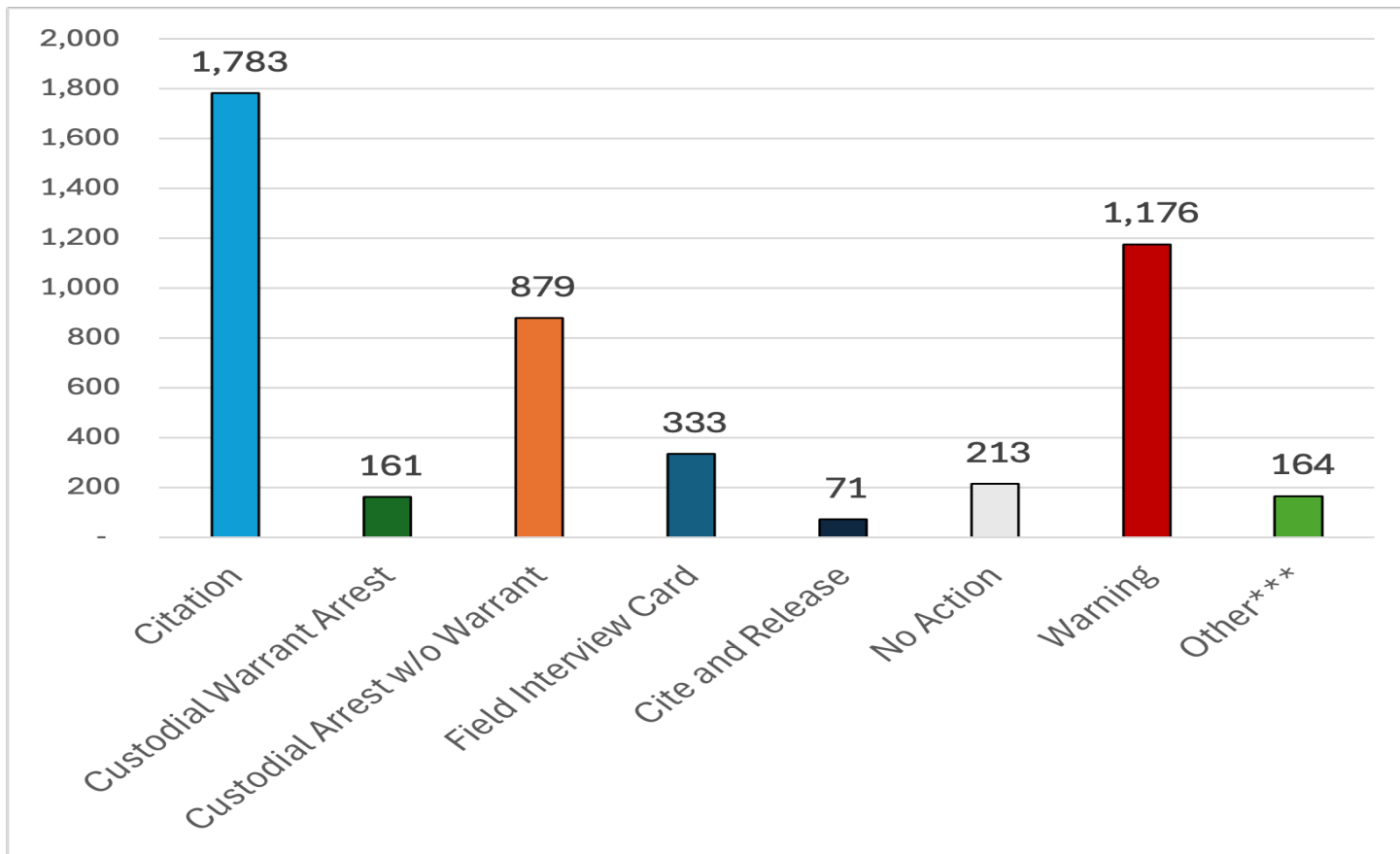
2023 SMPD Stop Actions by Perceived Races (Percent)

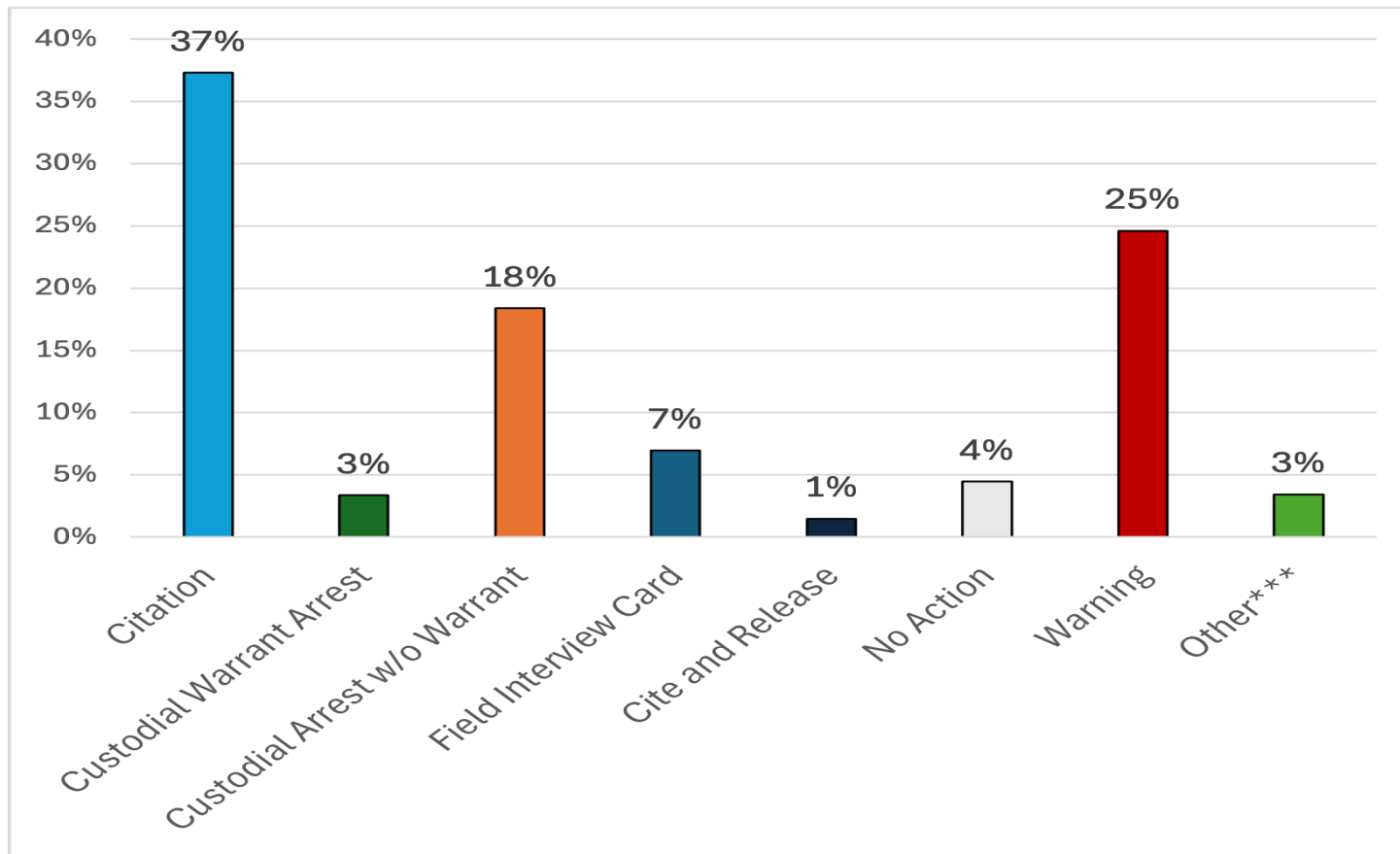

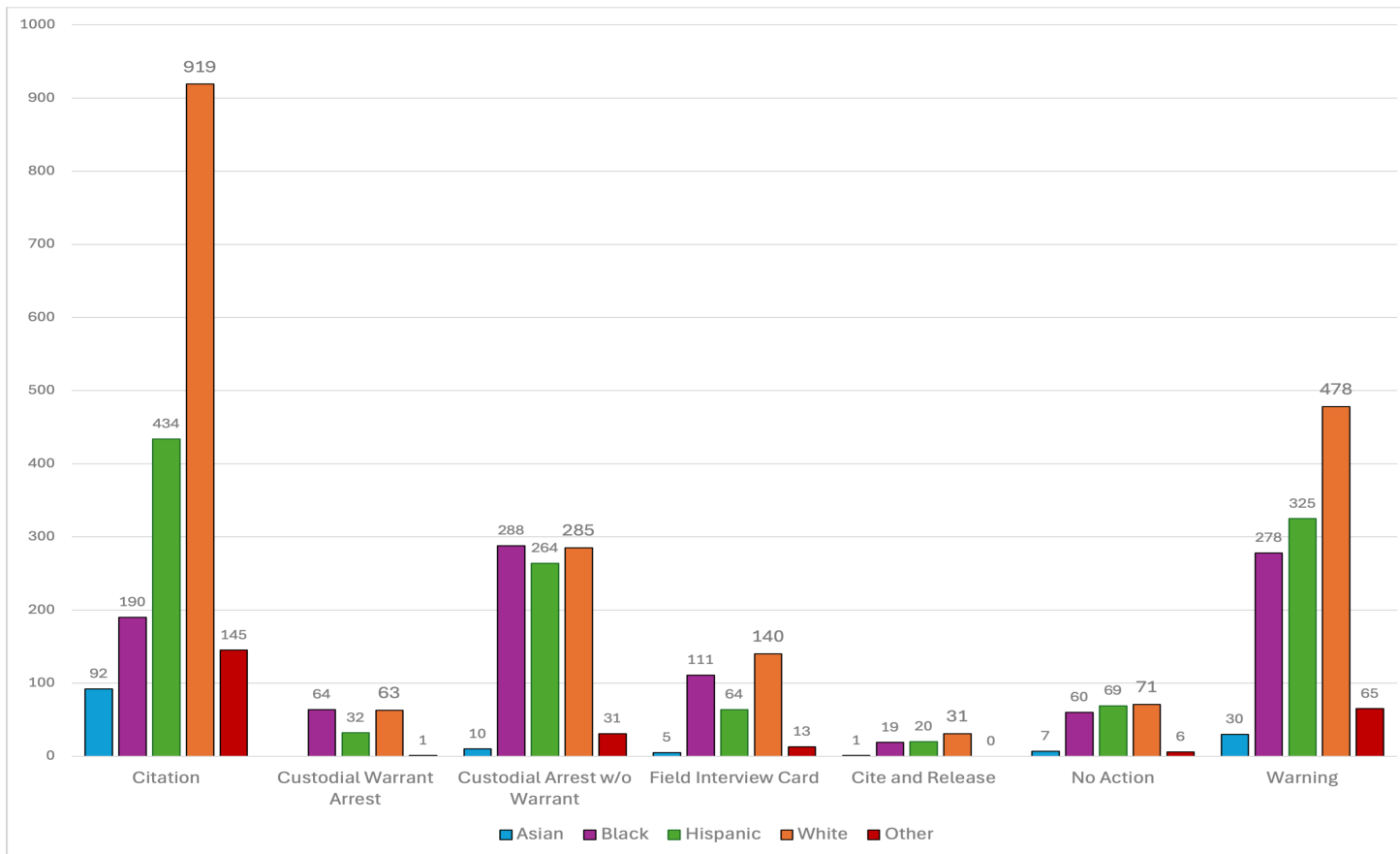

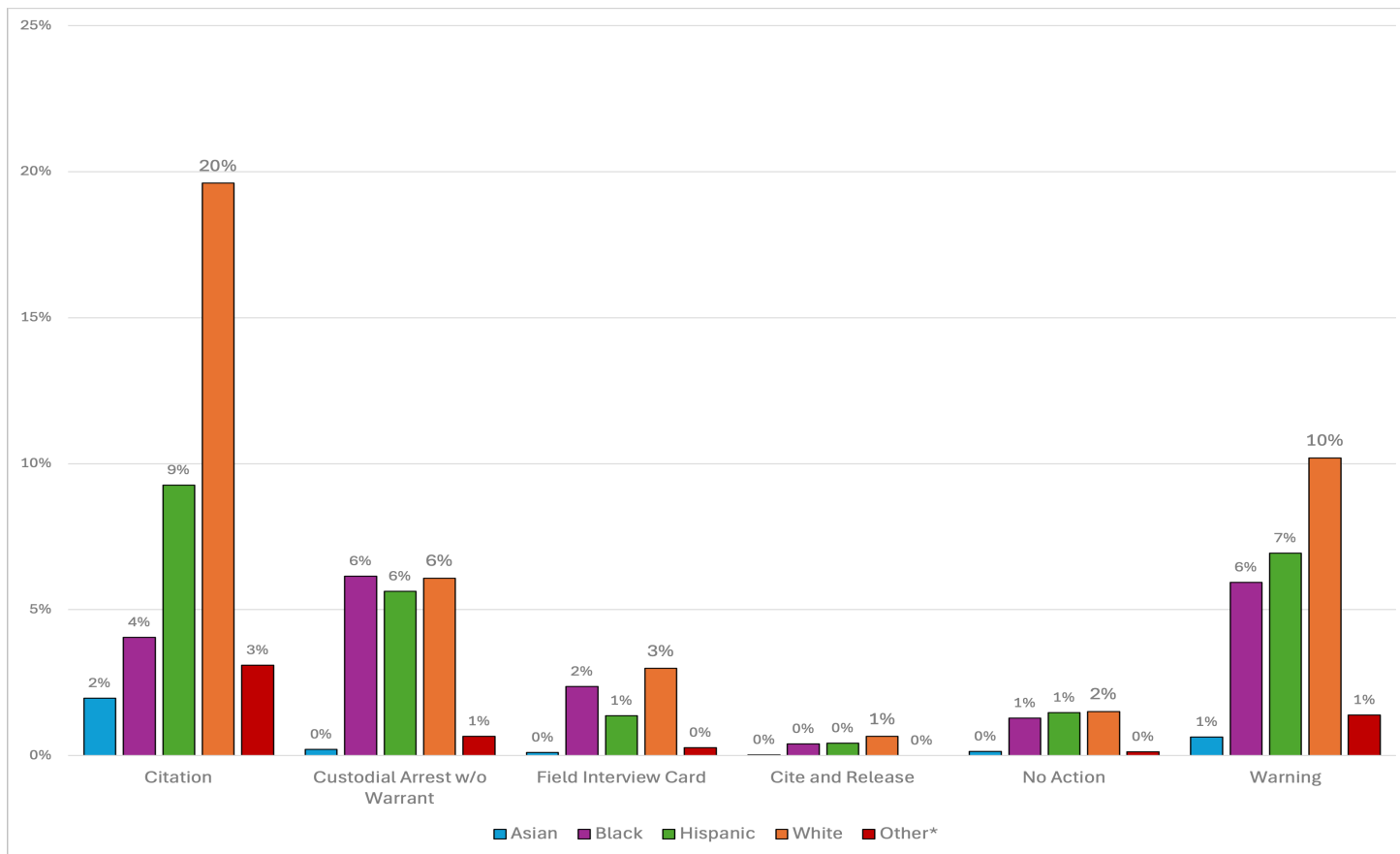
2023 SMPD Stop Results by Perceived Races (Number)

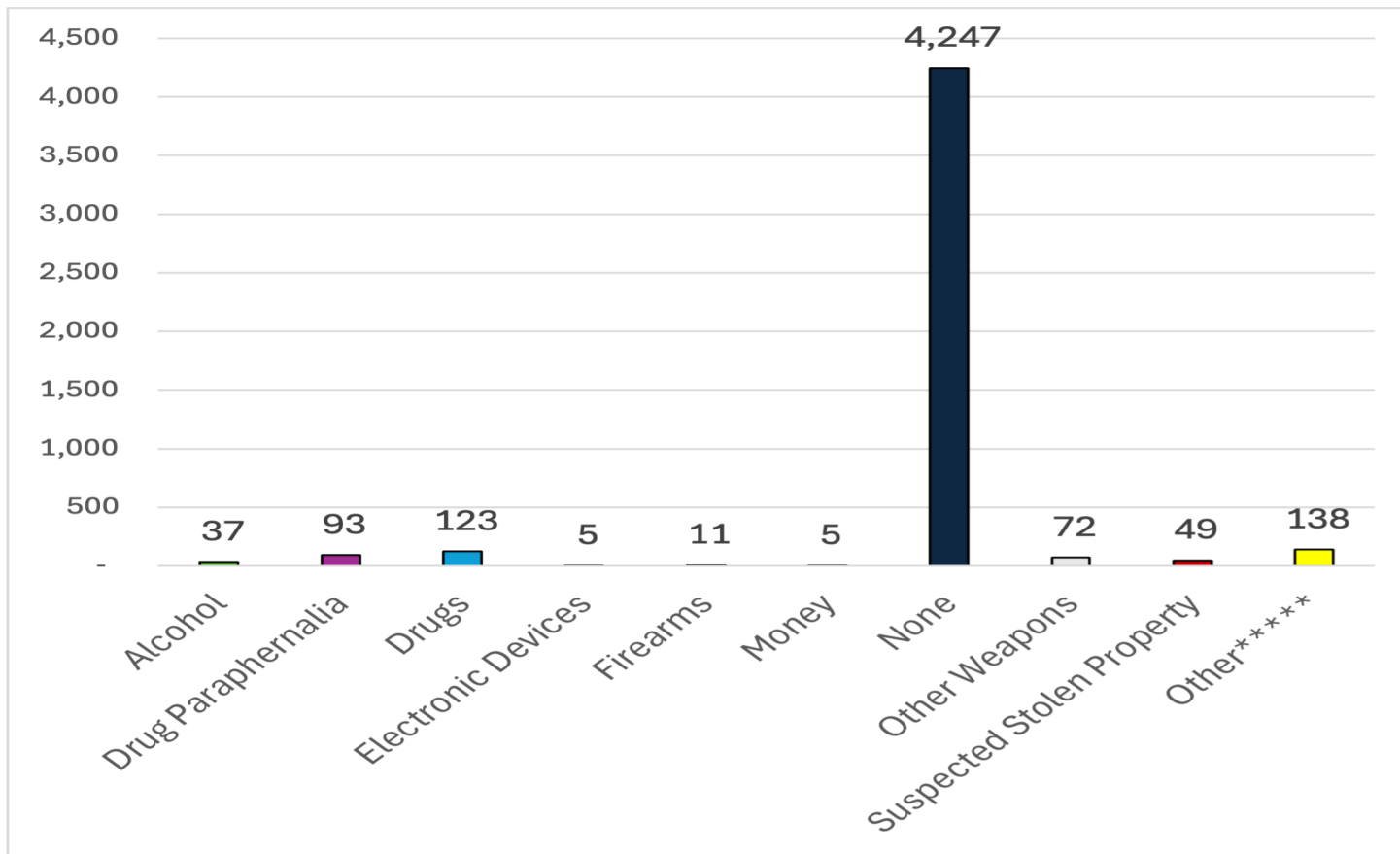

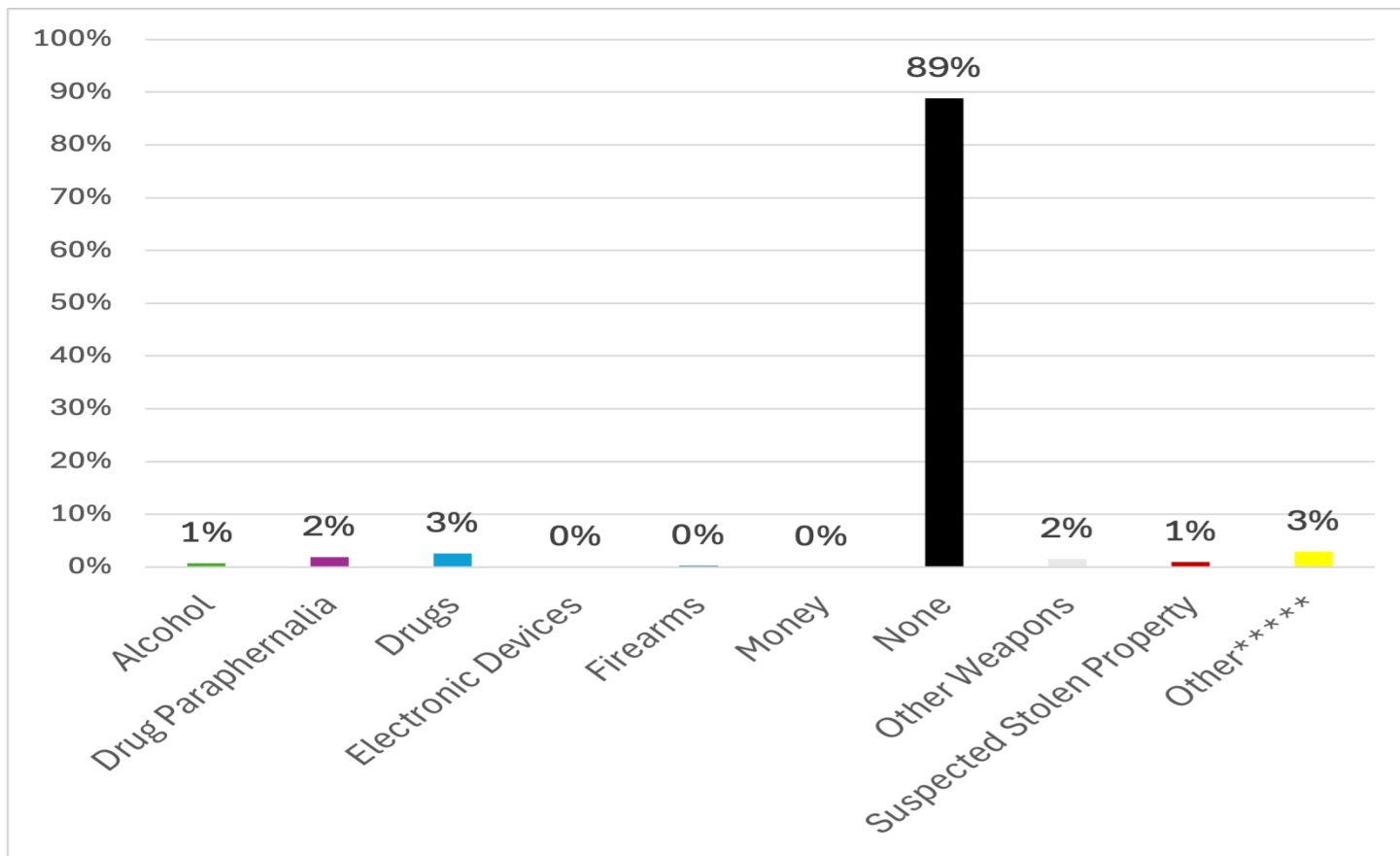


6: 2023 SMPD Contraband From Stops

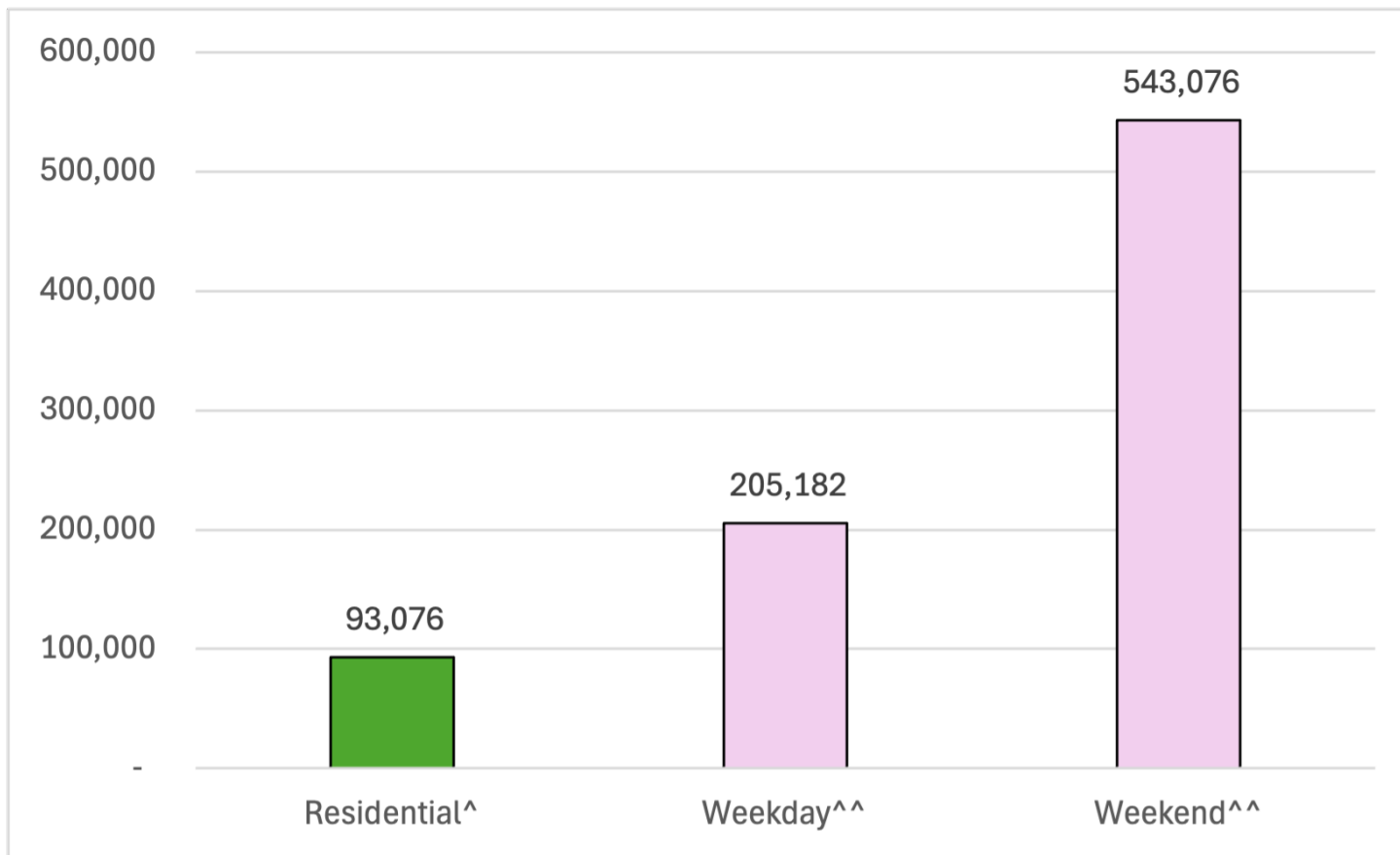

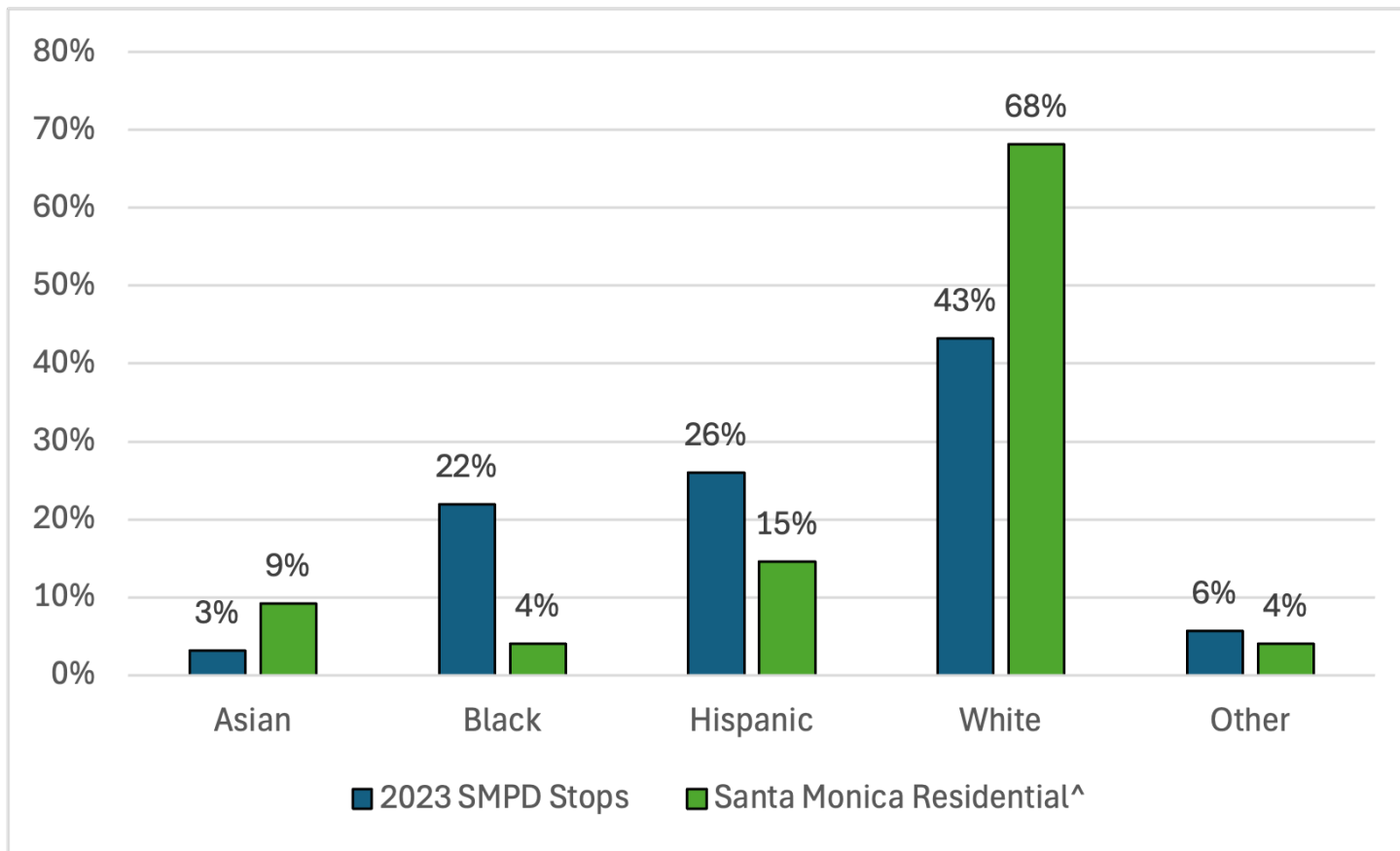

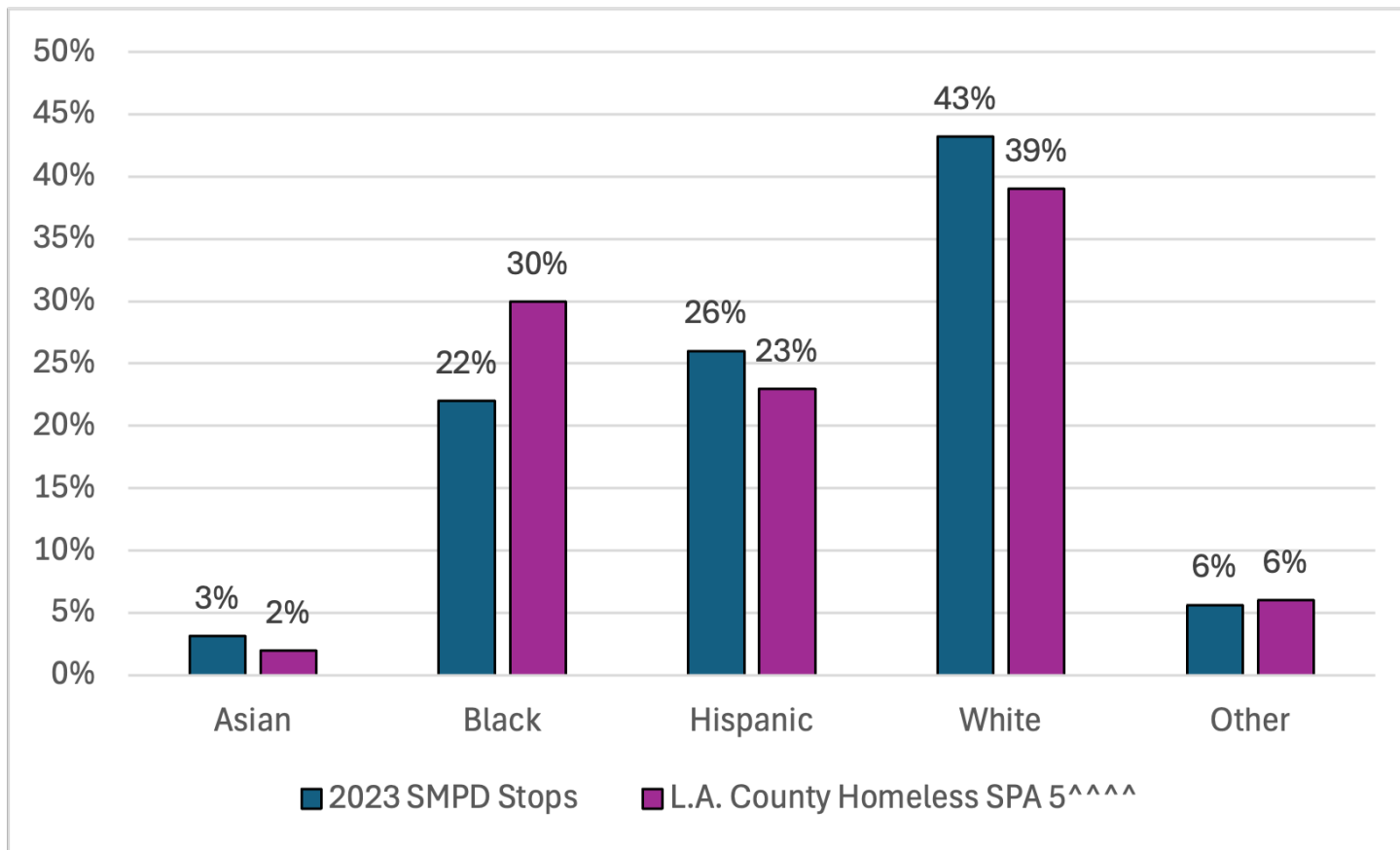
Residential, Weekday, and Weekend Populations (Number)



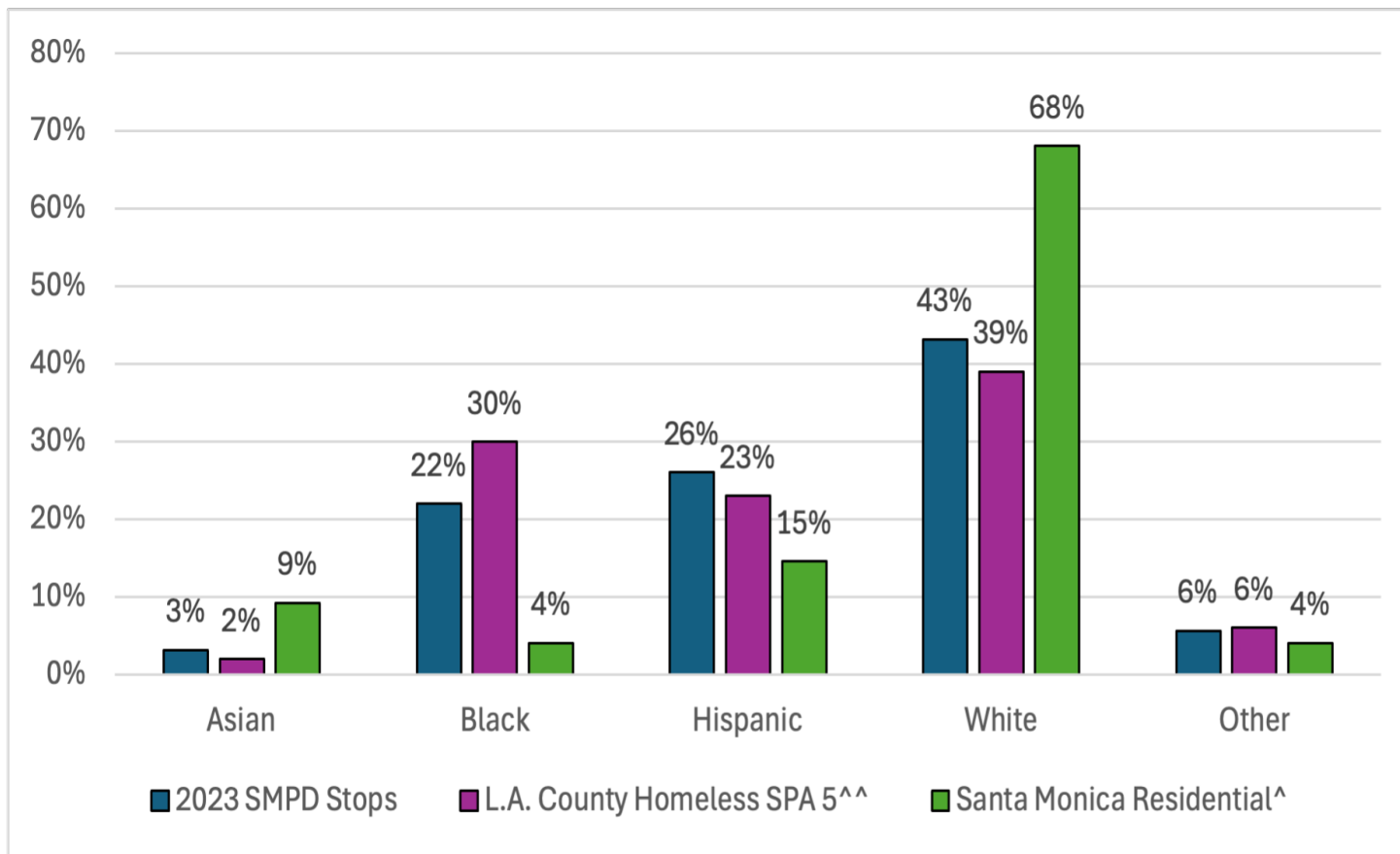
2023 SMPD Stops vs. Santa Monica Residential Population by Races (Percent)



2023 SMPD Stops vs. L.A. County SPA 5 Homeless Population by Races (Percent)



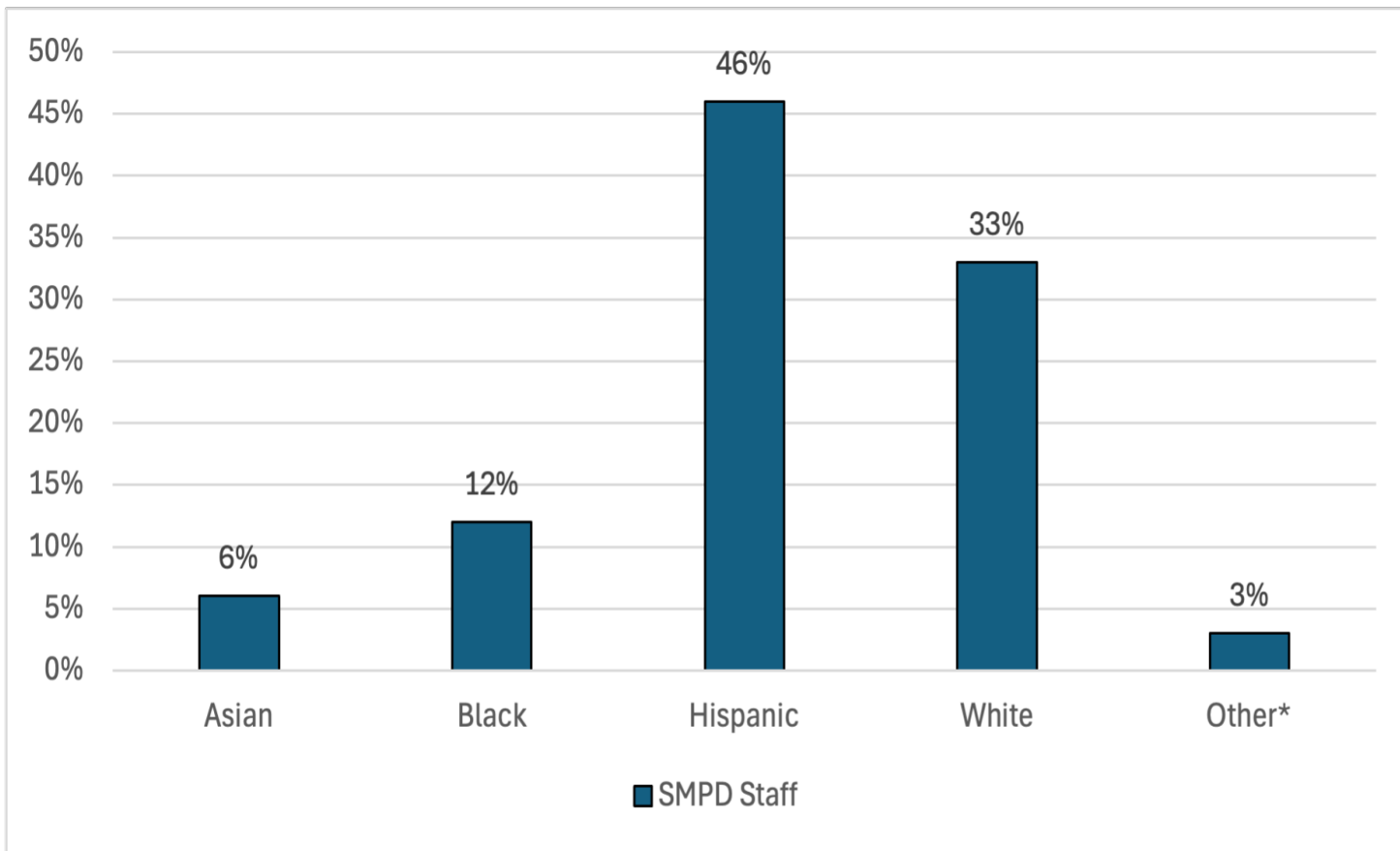
2023 SMPD Stops vs. Residential and SPA 5 Homeless Populations (Percent)



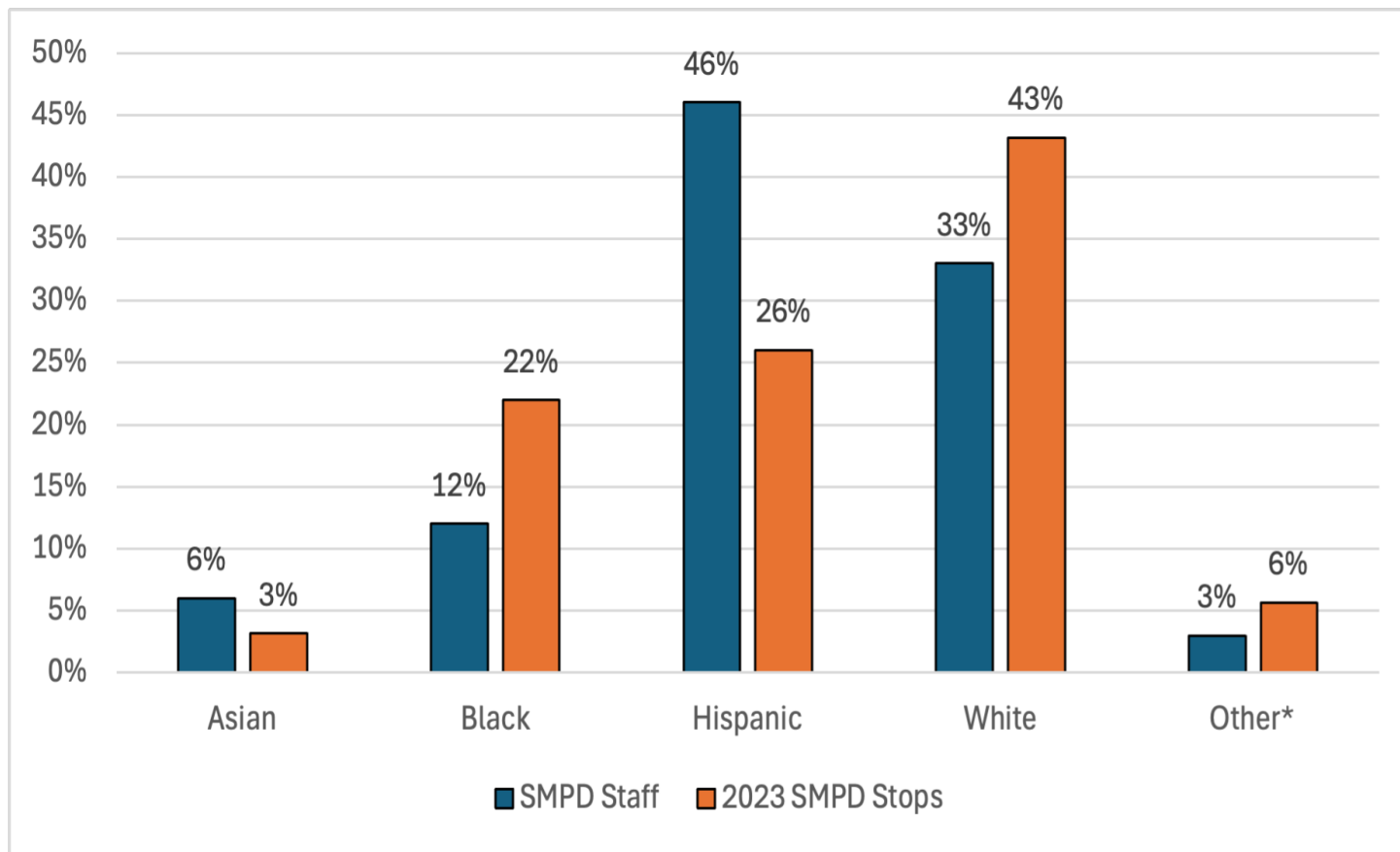
