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
HSGP Overview

- Responsive to changing community needs







- 4. Physical location in Santa Monica OR a description of plan to provide services to SMPP in Santa Monica



Other Supporting Documentation

Agencies will be scored on the following documents:

- 1. Organizational Chart
- 2. Policies and Procedures
- 3. Audited Financial Statements for the 3 most recent fiscal years
- 4. Program Monitoring Reports from agency's largest funder for last 2 years
- 5. Complete Program Participant Intake Packet, if applicable
- 6. Documentation of service partnerships and integration (MOUS, etc)
- 7. Federal approval of indirect cost rate
- 8. Up to 3 testimonials or letters of support from program participants (OPTIONAL)



Additional Documentation

Agencies must submit these administrative documents:

- 1. Living Wage/Oaks Disclosure Form
- 2. Non-Discrimination Policy
- 3. Santa Monica Business License- see who needs a license section in RFP
- 4. RFP Addenda- check a box that received
- 5. Notice Regarding Disclosure of Documents-check a box that received
