Levine Act Disclosure. Pursuant to the Levine Act (Govt Code Section 84308), any party to a permit, license, contract, or other entitlement before the Housing Commission is required to disclose on the record any contribution, including aggregated contributions, of more than \$250 made by the party or the party's agents within the preceding 12 months to any City official. Participants and agents are requested to make this disclosure as well. The disclosure must include the name of the party, participant, or agent, and any other person making the contribution; the name of the recipient, the amount of the contribution, and the date the contribution was made.

- (1) Written public comment: The public is encouraged to submit written public comment on agenda items via email to hhs@santamonica.gov. Written public comment submitted before 12:00 pm on the day of the meeting will be available for online viewing. Please note the agenda item number and letter in the subject line of your written comments.
- (2) Oral public comment: Additionally, oral public comment on agenda items can be given in person during the meeting. Oral public comments have a 3-minute time

limit per speaker, with a maximum of 6 minutes per meeting. Under some circumstances the Housing Commission may limit this time further.
