

Two-block Parking Rule (follow the diagram below):

- Your block of residence is the one marked with "X."
- The two-block area is defined by the number of blocks away from the hundred block on which you live. Every time you cross an intersection, turn a corner, or **move to the next hundred block** (e.g., 600/700 blocks between Montana and Alta Avenue), you have moved to another block.
- In addition to your own block, you can park on the blocks marked 1 or 2 **as long as** they are with the same preferential parking zone for which your address has been designated.
- Your permits and posted parking regulation signage around your home tell you which zone you are in.
- SMPD finds most offenses take place around Santa Monica College (Zone 2). Permit holders around this area should take special care to follow the two-block rule. Use your best judgment. If you think you have parked more than two blocks away, you probably have. Vehicles parking more than two blocks away from the permitted address are subject to citation
