

# Calls for Service






In 2023, there was a 1% decrease in the number of calls for service received when compared to those in 2022.

The number of citizeninitiated calls remained constant between 2021 and 2023. Approximately 25% of all recorded service calls are initiated by officers in a proactive manner. On average, dispositions related to homelessness account for 19% of all service calls.

# Parks Calls for Service







GTA levels have consistently increased over the past five years. Hyundai was the most stolen model for the past two years, followed by Toyota. Kia thefts have spiked in the last two years.


Cases of burglary peaked in 2020 and have since declined annually from 2021 to 2023 with a 3.4% decrease over 2022. Larceny was accountable for 59% of all Part I Crimes in Santa Monica in 2023.

Incidents of Arson decreased from 86 to 80 in 2023.


